CHURCHES
CAN PREVENT AND
END HUMAN TRAFFICKING.





Churches are already serving in every community and providing a refuge for the vulnerable. They know the needs of their community better than anyone. Each member of your congregation has an important role in preventing and ending human trafficking, as does your church as a whole. Congregations can leverage their skills, talents, gifts, and resources to end human trafficking and prevent it from happening in the first place. As a church leader, you can make a big difference with simple additions to what you are already doing every day. Below are common questions and answers to help you understand how churches can make a difference. #### **HOW YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE**

### ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE

#### WHAT IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING. IN THE U.S. AND ABROAD?

Human trafficking knows no geographic or economic bounds. It happens in urban cities and rural communities. It can occur in a variety of industries, such as construction, hospitality, and farming. Knowing what human trafficking looks like can help your staff and members identify and report in the communities you serve, in the U.S. and abroad.

#### WHERE IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING HAPPENING?

Human trafficking has been reported in all 50 states and may occur in countries where you serve or support missionaries. You can be aware of the types of human trafficking and demographic data that have been reported in every state and country, equipping your members and missionaries with the information they need to be knowledgeable about vulnerabilities specific communities face.

#### **HOW YOUTH ARE VULNERABLE**

Data has shown that human trafficking is happening in every state in the U.S. While there is no one face of a human trafficking victim, human trafficking disproportionally affects vulnerable individuals, including children in foster care, runaway and homeless youth, refugees, and those facing challenging situations, such as poverty, homelessness, or domestic violence.

Teens are vulnerable to human trafficking for many reasons outside of their control. They often face challenging or unstable family situations, making them at-risk to traffickers who seek to build trust and relationships before exploiting them. Youth often seek connection, affirmation, popularity, and acceptance from their friend groups, social media, and other outlets in the community. These are all ways that traffickers can monitor and engage with potential victims, establishing relationships before turning on them. Knowing the vulnerabilities, dangers, and risk-factors youth face can allow youth ministers, mentors, and outreach volunteers to talk to youth, offer support, and meet needs where traffickers would look to exploit.

## ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE CONTINUED

#### SUPPORT VULNERABLE YOUTH & YOUTH IN FOSTER CARE

Churches exist everywhere, and often already seek to meet the needs of those facing difficulties in their communities. Enhancing what youth ministries and church outreaches are already doing is a simple way that churches and leaders can engage. Supporting foster care families with tangible needs, grocery and laundry help, mentorship, and respite are ways that members can offer support to these families and fill gaps where traffickers would seek to step in. Churches can provide crucial assistance alongside government and community efforts to help end and prevent human trafficking from happening in the communities they serve.

#### **INCORPORATING BIBLE STUDIES AND PRAYER GUIDES**

Churches can include/incorporate human trafficking into designated prayer times. Prayer guides exist to help members know how to specifically pray for individuals impacted by trafficking and the issues that surround it. Churches can also introduce human trafficking and social justice to members, both youth and adults, through Bible studies that are specific to these topics. Equipping members with resources for further study can enhance their understanding and engagement.

#### **HOW CAN WE INCORPORATE FAIR TRADE PRODUCTS?**

Your church can support farmers with fair wages by purchasing fair trade products, including coffee to serve before and after your services and during fellowship events. Church bookstores can carry fair trade and survivor-made products to economically empower survivors. Explore products from the U.S. and from countries around the world.

#### **SHARING WITH MISSIONS TEAMS AND MISSIONARIES**

Whether your missions and outreach are focused locally or abroad, your members who serve in this capacity can be educated on what makes certain populations vulnerable, warning signs to look for, and simple ways they can step in where a trafficker would look to fill a void. If they know tactics of traffickers, build relationships with other churches, organizations, and leaders, they can be equipped to prevent human trafficking and help end it. Program phones with local hotline contacts to ensure members can report any suspicious activity they see.

#### HOW CAN I RECEIVE CURRENT UPDATES ABOUT HUMAN TRAFFICKING?

Following trusted organizations on social media and specific hashtags can help you have the latest information and be inspired with ways you can engage. Staying up-to-date with new resources, facts, cases, and ways others are engaging will help you know trends and changes in the movement. You can also sign up for google alerts about human trafficking in your community.
