HOW TO USE THIS REPORT

Each county-level report includes data insights and recommendations unique to that county.

Here are some helpful details on how to understand and use them.

1 Vulnerable Population index (VPI) score

Every county report includes the overall VPI score for that county, which is developed from a variety of publicly available data sources to help identify communities with a higher **prevalence of the vulnerabilities that human traffickers often exploit**. The higher the index score, the higher the vulnerability within that community. Learn more about the VPI at engagetogether.com/sfl.

2 # of organizations working to support your county

This number represents the number of organizations who report that they are **presently able to serve and support your county**. Importantly, it does not represent how many organizations have a physical location in the county, how accessible those services are to those who need them in your county, or how many individuals those organizations can serve. These will all be questions you'll want to ask as you build connections with the organizations available to your county. We've included a bulleted list of organizations that can serve each county in this report, along with a link to the full Directory.

3 Sector engagement chart

Increasing engagement of multiple sectors in your community will be **key to a successful anti-trafficking effort**. Those sectors that are needed include not just government agencies and nonprofits, but also businesses, educators, healthcare professionals, churches/houses of worship, civic/service clubs, individual practitioners, foundations, and professional associations. Each sector is uniquely positioned to fill gaps in your local community's strategy to end and prevent human trafficking and to provide needed support for victims, survivors, and at-risk populations.



Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Collin County include individuals experiencing poverty, homelessness, hunger, or DV/SA, and refugees and recent migrants. Those that currently receive the least support include **youth in and aging out of foster care**, **drug endangered children**, and individuals who are either **justice- or gang-involved**.

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Collin County's overall VPI score in Texas is high at 84%, driven by even higher scores in 3 of 6 categories of risk as follows:

Human Trafficking (98%): prevalence of known and/or identified human trafficking activity, as indicated by hotline stats, IMB counts, and crimes of human trafficking

At-Risk Industries (98%): prevalence of business types and industries where victims of labor and/or sex trafficking are often exploited

Local Environment (93%): prevalence of crimes that are often correlated with or can escalate to trafficking (e.g. domestic violence, sexual assault, weapons or drug offenses)

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Given the prevalence of many risk factors, Collin Co. will need to proactively strengthen strategies to better address **both sex and labor trafficking**, including **outreach** to at-risk populations to help them know how to stay safe or seek help.

Train all 158 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

As trainings increase, identifications will follow. Mobilize **multi-sector engagement** to meet needs and fill gaps.

Increase **demand reduction** efforts through a combination of strengthening criminal justice reforms and shifting community culture, and shut down IMBs.



While Cooke County's overall VPI score in Texas is 56.7%, it scores higher than that in 3 of 6 categories of risk as follows:

At-Risk Industries (74.8%): prevalence of business types and industries where victims of labor and/or sex trafficking are often exploited

Demographics (64.8%): prevalence of individuals who may lack support networks and safety nets (e.g. individuals who are foreign-born or non-English-speaking, single-parent households, and individuals with disabilities)

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Traffickers often exploit vulnerabilities by luring victims first with promises of work, shelter, food, and support. **Proactively connect at-risk individuals in Cooke Co. to safe and supportive community** to prevent exploitation.

Train all 54 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to **both labor** and sex trafficking.

Strengthen local strategies and partnerships to **identify and support** drug endangered children and system involved youth.

Build bridges to existing human trafficking programs across North Texas, especially temporary shelters, victim advocates, immediate services, and long-term support.



RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

With so many risk factors present in Dallas Co., and so many organizations working to address them, **strengthening collaborations** across all those actively engaged in supporting victims, survivors, and at-risk populations will be key to increasing **outreach**, **interventions**, and **care**.

Train all 355 organizations working with atrisk populations how to recognize and respond to **both labor and sex trafficking**.

Strengthen **demand reduction** efforts and shut down IMBs.

Mobilize **multi-sector engagement** alongside government and nonprofit efforts **to identify** human trafficking, and **to meet needs** and increase support for all victims, survivors, and at-risk populations.
