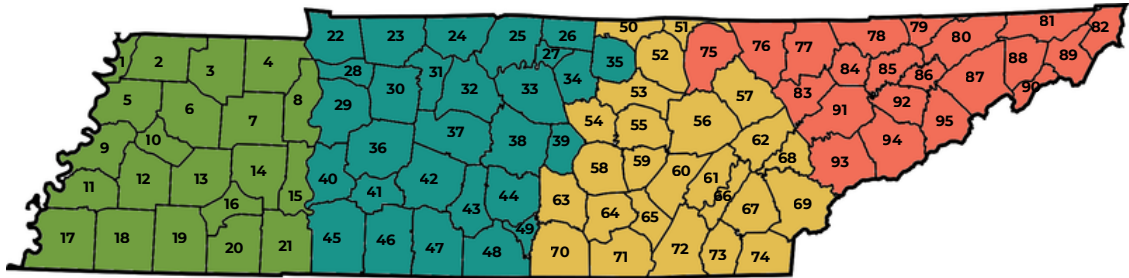

HOW TO USE THIS REPORT

Each county-level report includes data insights and recommendations unique to that county.

Here are some helpful details on how to understand and use them.

1 Vulnerable Population Index (VPI) score

Every county report includes the overall VPI score for that county, which is developed from a variety of publicly available and shared data sources to help identify communities with a higher **prevalence of the vulnerabilities that human traffickers often exploit**. The higher the index score, the higher the risk that vulnerable populations within the community may be impacted by human trafficking. Review the second page of each county report for more details.

2 # of organizations working to address human trafficking

These numbers represent the organizations who share that they are **presently able to serve and support your county**. Importantly, it does not represent how many organizations have a physical location in the county, how accessible those services are to those who need them in your county, or how many individuals those organizations can serve. These will all be questions you'll want to ask as you build connections with the organizations available to your county. A list of those organizations and links to the Directory with contact details are on the second page of each county report.

3 Sector engagement chart

Increasing engagement of multiple sectors in your community will be **key to a successful anti-trafficking effort**. Those sectors that are needed include not just government agencies and nonprofits, but also businesses, educators, healthcare, churches/houses of worship, civic/service clubs, practitioners, foundations, and professional associations. Each sector is uniquely positioned to fill gaps in your community's strategy to end human trafficking and to provide needed support for victims, survivors, and the organizations working to help those in need in your community.

4 Programs highlighted in yellow

We highlight items in yellow to point out which program areas (primary and secondary) **need to be strengthened** to improve your local efforts to end human trafficking, and to care well for all those impacted by it. Learn more about program definitions [at this link](#).

DEFINITIONS

Engage Together assesses community response and risk according to the following categories. Here are some quick definitions to provide further insight into how the data is catalogued and analyzed in each category to produce these reports.

RESPONSE

Program Category Definitions

PREVENTION

Includes efforts that are focused on raising awareness, addressing demand, or working with at-risk and vulnerable populations

IDENTIFICATION

Includes efforts that are focused on providing sector or profession-specific training on human trafficking, or engaging in outreach in the community to identify trafficking

EXIT

Includes efforts that are focused on engaging in intervention efforts, or providing temporary shelter, immediate services, or victim advocacy on behalf of victims and survivors of human trafficking

RESTORATION

Includes efforts that are focused on supporting aftercare or reintegration programs or services for survivors of human trafficking

REFORMS

Includes efforts that are focused on working to change laws, policies, or systems to better address human trafficking

RISK

Vulnerable Population Index (VPI) Category Definitions

The Overall VPI score is a percentile ranking that indicates the level of risk for human trafficking based on the presence and prevalence of risk factors in six key vulnerability categories:

AT-RISK INDUSTRIES

VULNERABILITIES

Prevalence of business types and industries where victims of labor and/or sex trafficking are often exploited

DEMOGRAPHIC

VULNERABILITIES

Prevalence of individuals who may lack support networks and safety nets (e.g. individuals who are foreign-born or non-English-speaking, single-parent households, and individuals with disabilities)

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

VULNERABILITIES

Prevalence of indicated and/or identified human trafficking activity, as indicated by TBI hotline tips, identified cases of commercial sexual exploitation of minors (CSEM), online classified ads, IMB counts, and commercial sex offenses

LOCAL ENVIRONMENT

VULNERABILITIES

Prevalence of crimes that are often correlated with or can escalate to trafficking (e.g. domestic violence, sexual assault, weapons or drug offenses)

SOCIO-ECONOMIC

VULNERABILITIES

Prevalence of individuals experiencing financial, housing, food, or job insecurities

YOUTH

VULNERABILITIES

Prevalence of at-risk youth, including chronically absent, homeless, disconnected and/or justice-involved youth; children in and aging out of foster care; child victims of crimes, including CSEM; unaccompanied minors; and minors with disabilities

A county with a score below 40% is considered low risk, 40-59% is considered at-risk, 60-84% is considered elevated risk, and 85% or above is considered extreme risk. Not all counties had enough data to accurately analyze their level of risk (which is called out in those county reports). Of note, regardless of the level of risk, human trafficking has been identified in all 95 counties in Tennessee.

The following section includes reports and recommendations for each of the 21 counties considered to be in the West Region by the TBI Human Trafficking Task Force and are presented in alphabetical order. These assessments are based on both open-source and shared data gathered in 2025-2026.

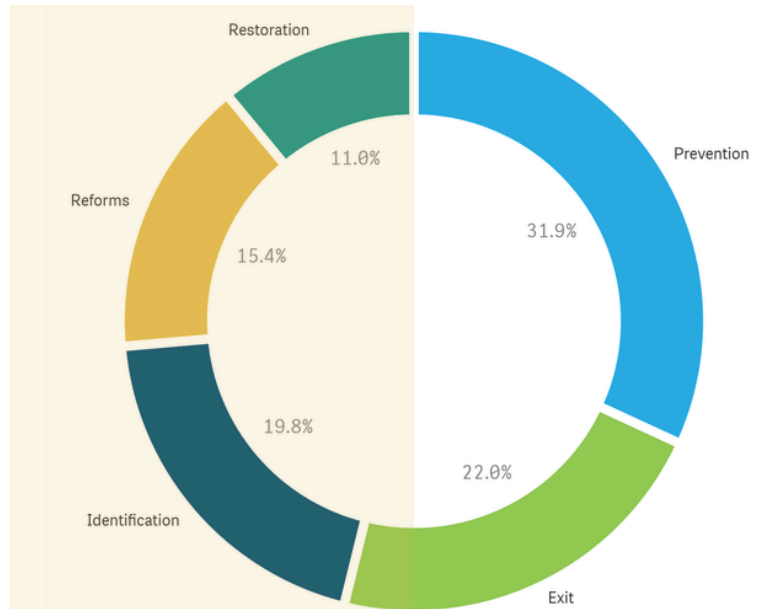

AT-RISK POPULATIONS

Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Benton County include individuals experiencing domestic violence/sexual assault, children and youth in foster care, and individuals experiencing poverty. Those that currently receive the least support include those who are **gang-involved**, those **experiencing hunger**, individuals who are **justice-involved**, and **drug endangered children**.

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Benton County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 40%. However, other categories of risk (or specific risk factors) score higher, as follows:

Benton County demonstrates **exceptionally high prevalence scores for both children and adults with disabilities**, along with significant youth vulnerabilities—including unaccompanied homeless youth, youth aging out of foster care, and **identified CSEM**. When combined with elevated rates of drug offenses and high levels of poverty and food insecurity, these conditions indicate a strong likelihood of human trafficking activity that remains largely under-identified.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Traffickers exploit socio-economic vulnerabilities by luring victims first with promises of work, shelter, food, and support. **Meeting the basic needs** of vulnerable youth and families in your community will directly impact prevention from exploitation.

Train all 79 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Establish partnerships with local healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

Form a multidisciplinary working group with disability-service partners to strengthen training, awareness, and response protocols for human trafficking.

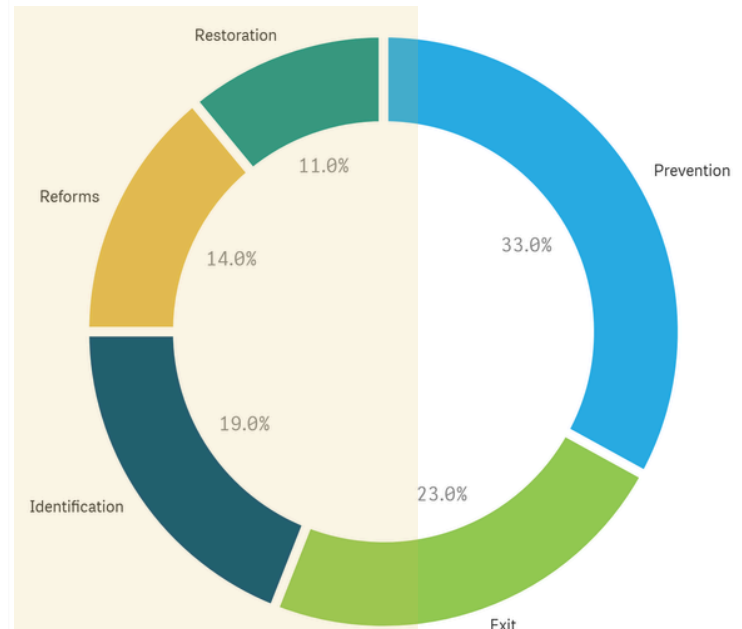

Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Carroll County include individuals experiencing domestic violence/sexual assault, children and youth in foster care, and individuals experiencing poverty. Those that currently receive the least support include those that are **gang-involved**, those **experiencing hunger**, and **drug endangered children**.

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Carroll County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 8%. However, other categories of risk (or specific risk factors) score higher, as follows:

Carroll County demonstrates an **exceptionally high prevalence of unaccompanied homeless youth, followed by youth aging out of foster care**. These vulnerabilities, coupled with very high rates of homelessness, food insecurity, and poverty, and elevated drug and weapons offenses, create conditions that significantly increase the risk of human trafficking. The county's reliance on large-scale farming and access to major freight routes further heighten this risk.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Because traffickers often target homeless youth, exploiting vulnerabilities with false promises of love, work, shelter, food, and support, **expand youth-specific homeless shelters and implement targeted human trafficking outreach programs**.

Train all 80 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Expand labor trafficking prevention and response efforts by proactively engaging at-risk industries and vulnerable workers.

Develop partnerships with the **healthcare** and **faith-based community** to strengthen prevention and early identification.

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Lauderdale County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 92%, which is considered extreme risk for human trafficking, driven by exceedingly high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Lauderdale County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with **some of the highest youth vulnerabilities in the state**—including the **highest rates of juvenile court referrals** and high numbers of youth with disabilities and unaccompanied homeless youth. When combined with elevated rates of other sex offenses, sexual assault/domestic violence (SA/DV), and **identified CSEM cases**, alongside significant poverty, food insecurity, and homelessness—and the presence of large-scale farming and a women's prison with reentry-related vulnerabilities—these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity, including under-identified cases.

Train all 78 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Increase local accessibility of temporary shelters, victim advocates, and reintegration support for all victims of crime, including survivors of human trafficking.

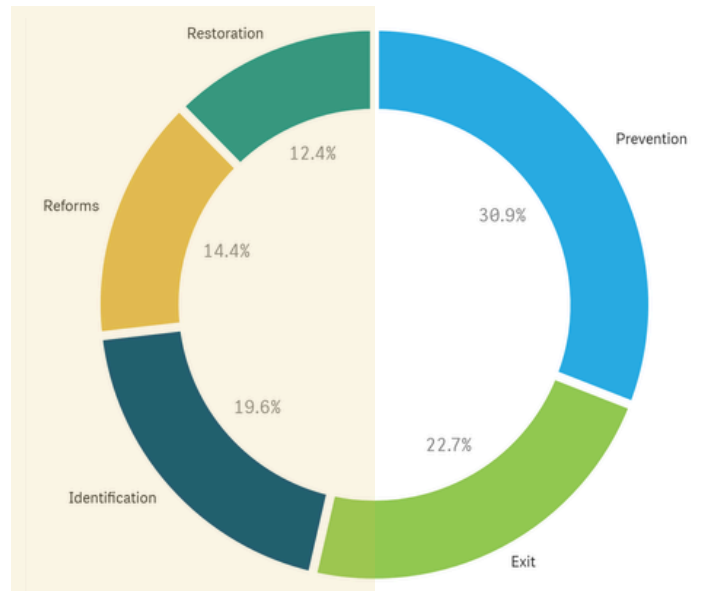

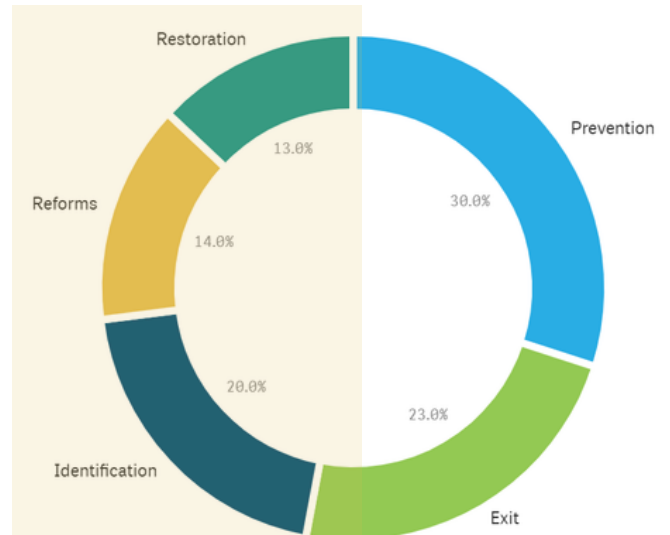

Develop a coordinated cross-state response with Alcorn County, Mississippi to address human trafficking risks along this corridor.

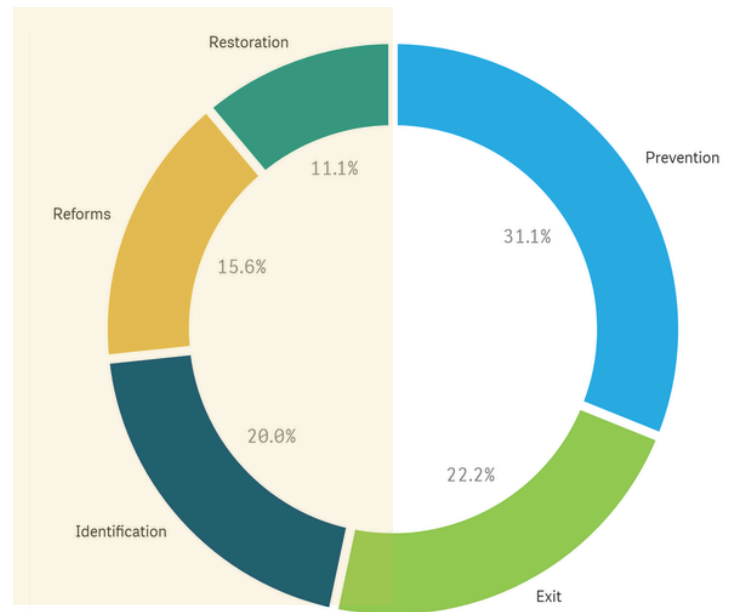

Obion County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with an **exceptionally high prevalence of large-scale farming and elevated rates of crimes often associated with trafficking**—including drug offenses, weapons offenses, abductions, sexual assault/domestic violence (SA/DV), and other sex offenses. When combined with elevated levels of unaccompanied homeless and disconnected youth, alongside high rates of poverty, food insecurity, and homelessness, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity—particularly labor trafficking—within the county's rural landscape, including under-identified cases.

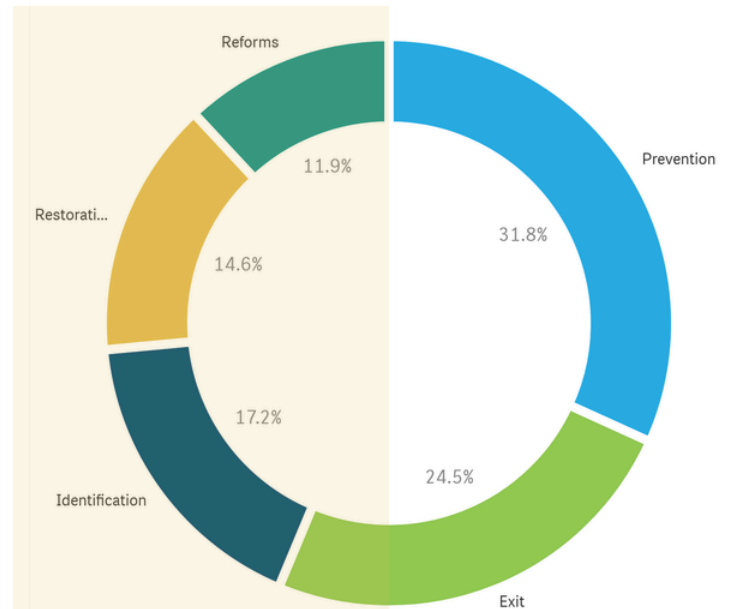

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Shelby County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is **100%**, which is considered extreme risk for human trafficking, driven by exceedingly high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Shelby County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with the **highest rates in the state of sexual assault/domestic violence (SA/DV), weapons offenses, and child victim offenses**, alongside **exceptionally high trafficking indicators—including human trafficking tip calls, classified ads, IMBs, commercial sex offenses, and identified CSEM cases.**

When combined with at-risk industries such as construction day labor, manufacturing, tourism, beauty establishments, and strip clubs, along with high levels of abductions, gang activity, vulnerable youth populations, and significant foreign-born, limited English-speaking communities, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of both sex and labor trafficking activity, including under-identified cases.

Traffickers often exploit children and youth with histories of abuse, neglect, and family instability—frequently linked to SA/DV—by promising love and a better future. **Establish a coordinated, multidisciplinary response** across child-serving agencies, including schools, with unified training, standardized protocols, and trauma-informed care.

Prioritize demand-reduction efforts targeting traffickers, buyers, gangs, and illicit massage businesses (IMBs) across all forms of human trafficking.

Increase local accessibility of temporary shelters, victim advocates, and reintegration support for all victims of crime, including survivors of human trafficking.

Establish partnerships with local health care organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and response protocols.

Train all 218 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Expand labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries and vulnerable workers.

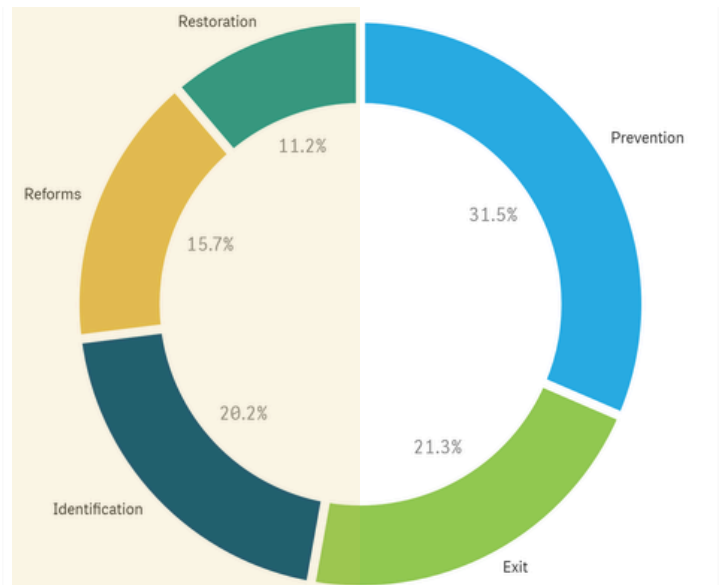

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Tipton County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 46%. However, other categories of risk (or specific risk factors) score higher, as follows:

Tipton County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with **exceptionally high crime rates—including other sex offenses, drug offenses, and SA/DV**—alongside elevated juvenile court referrals, unaccompanied homeless youth, and child victim offenses. When combined with large-scale farming and proximity to Memphis, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity, including under-identified cases.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Increase local accessibility of temporary shelters, victim advocates, and reintegration support for all victims of crime, including survivors of human trafficking.

Train all 81 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Establish partnerships with local health care organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and response protocols.

Expand efforts to address labor trafficking, including proactive outreach to at-risk populations and industries.

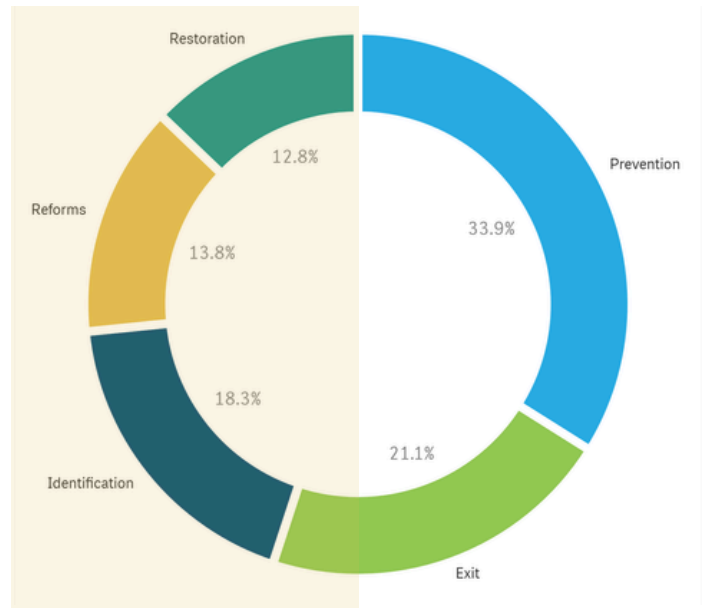

AT-RISK POPULATIONS

Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Davidson County include individuals experiencing poverty, homelessness, and domestic violence/sexual assault. Those that currently receive the least support include those that are **gang-involved, youth aging out of foster care, and drug endangered children.**

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Davidson County's overall VPI score is the 3rd highest in Tennessee at 98%, which is considered extreme risk for human trafficking, driven by exceedingly high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Davidson County (Nashville) demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, driven by its **extensive tourism industry and the state's highest concentration of at-risk industries**—including bars/strip clubs, beauty, construction day labor, and manufacturing. The county also has the **highest number of strip clubs and IMBs, the largest foreign-born, limited English-speaking population, the most trafficking tip calls, and the highest rates of homelessness, including unaccompanied youth and refugee children, and identified CSAM.** When combined with **exceptionally high rates of SA/DV and child victim offenses,** and the presence of a large women's prison, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of both identified and under-identified trafficking activity.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Expand labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries—including business, manufacturing, beauty services, bars, tourism, and transportation—and vulnerable workers, such as foreign-born and non-English-speaking populations, while ensuring access to support, housing, and legal services.

Train all 233 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Build on existing services to expand access to temporary shelter, victim advocacy, and long-term reintegration support for trafficking survivors.

Provide human trafficking **education and exit support** for women in local prison facilities.

Prioritize demand-reduction efforts targeting traffickers, buyers, gangs, and illicit massage businesses (IMBs) across all forms of human trafficking.

Establish partnerships with local health care organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and response protocols.

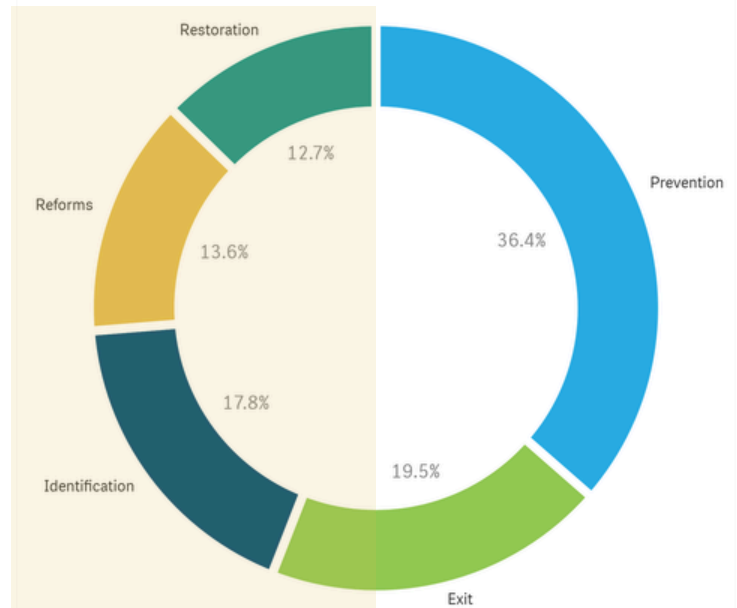

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Dickson County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 42%. However, other categories of risk (or specific risk factors) score higher, as follows:

Dickson County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with **proximity to Nashville** and **elevated youth vulnerabilities**—including children with disabilities, child victim offenses, juvenile court referrals, and children in state custody. When combined with the **presence of at-risk industries**—including construction day labor, tourism, and manufacturing—these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity, including unidentified cases.

Train all 95 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

To strengthen prevention, **engage the faith-based community** to help meet the basic needs of at-risk families and youth.

Equip local healthcare and child-serving professionals to strengthen prevention, early intervention, and care, with a focus on training and protocol development.

Traffickers often exploit youth with histories of abuse, neglect, homelessness, school disengagement, or family and youth drug involvement by promising love and a better future. **Establish a coordinated response across child-serving agencies**—including schools and juvenile justice—with unified training (including forced criminality and familial trafficking), education for children and families, standardized protocols, and trauma-informed care.

Train all 82 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Establish partnerships with key stakeholders to strengthen data collection in critical areas—including SA/DV, missing persons, poverty and food insecurity, and youth aging out of care—to improve planning, prevention, and early identification of human trafficking.

Traffickers often target communities affected by natural disasters, such as the 2021 floods. **Assess local and nearby service capacity** and **engage the faith-based community** to support vulnerable families and youth.

Expand sex and labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries—including the transportation sector—and vulnerable workers, including foreign-born and limited-English-speaking populations, while ensuring access to support, services, and housing.

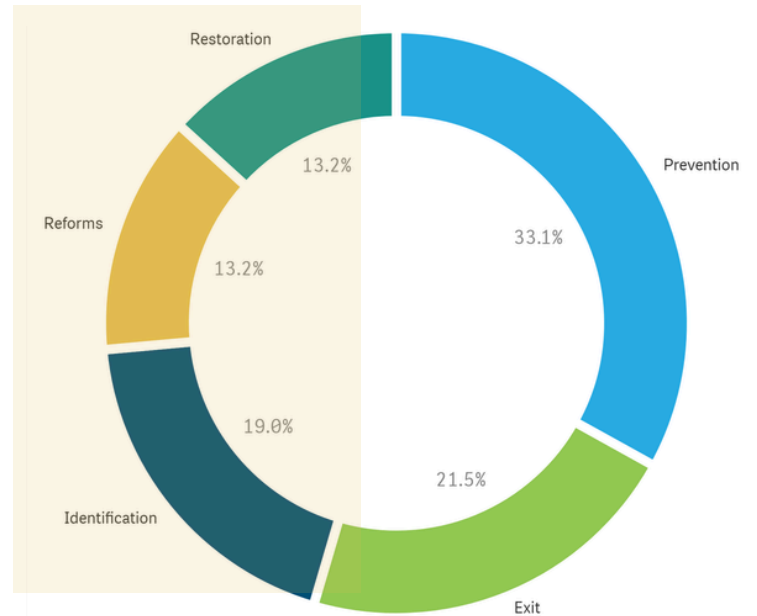

VPI SCORE DETAILS

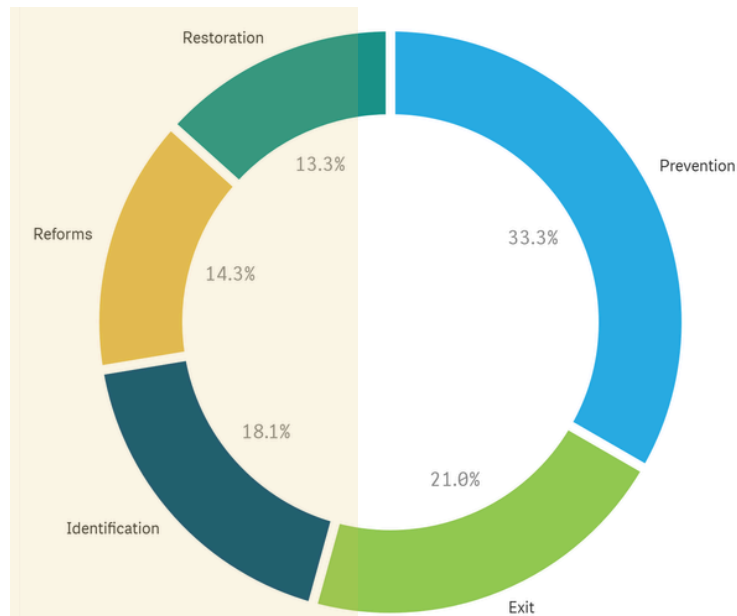

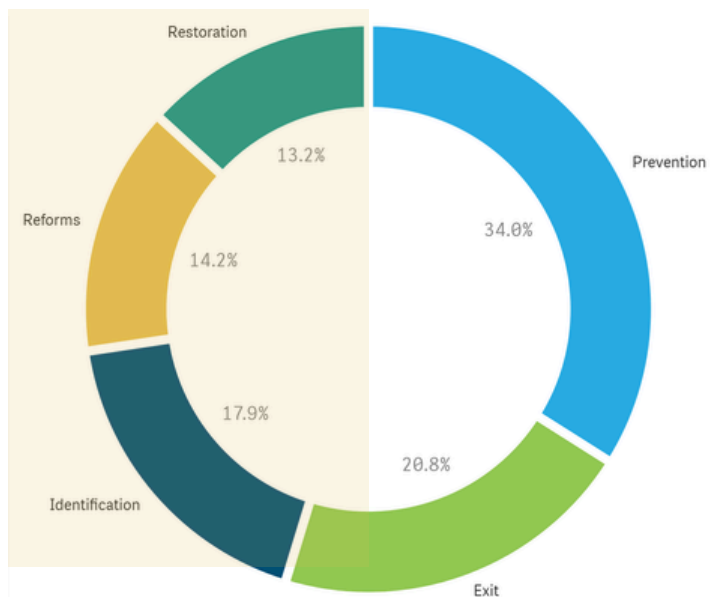

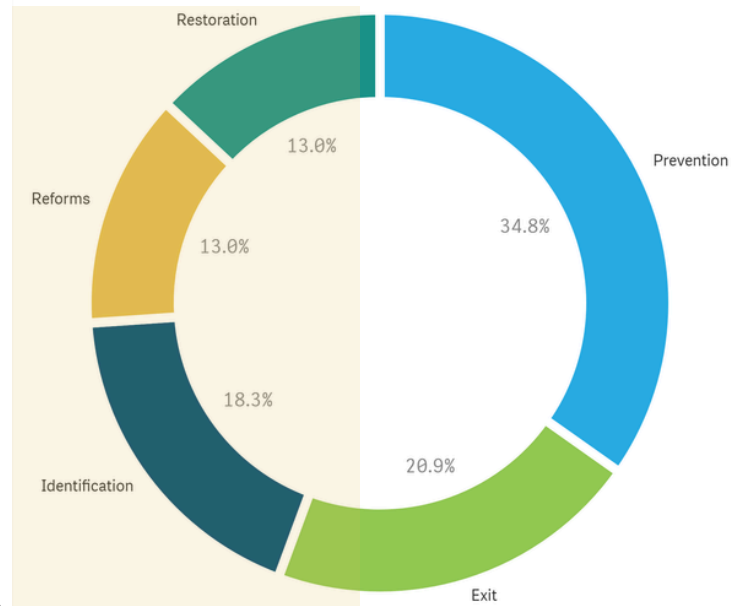

AT-RISK POPULATIONS

Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Robertson County include individuals experiencing poverty, children and youth in foster care, and individuals experiencing domestic violence/sexual assault or homelessness. Those that currently receive the least support include those that are **gang-involved, drug endangered children**, and individuals **experiencing hunger**.

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Robertson County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 51%. However, other categories of risk (or specific risk factors) score higher, as follows:

Robertson County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with an **exceptionally high prevalence of large-scale farming** and additional at-risk industries including manufacturing, construction, tourism, and beauty. When combined with **significant foreign-born, limited English-speaking populations, including unaccompanied refugee children**, and high rates of abductions, missing persons, drug offenses, and SA/DV, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity, including under-identified cases.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Expand labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging the agricultural community and vulnerable workers—including foreign-born and non-English-speaking populations—while ensuring access to support, housing, and legal services.

Train all 91 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Establish partnerships with local healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

To strengthen prevention, **engage the faith-based community** to help meet the basic needs of at-risk individuals and families.

Establish a multidisciplinary collaborative to assess the very high rates of abductions and missing persons, evaluate potential links to human trafficking, and develop a coordinated response plan.

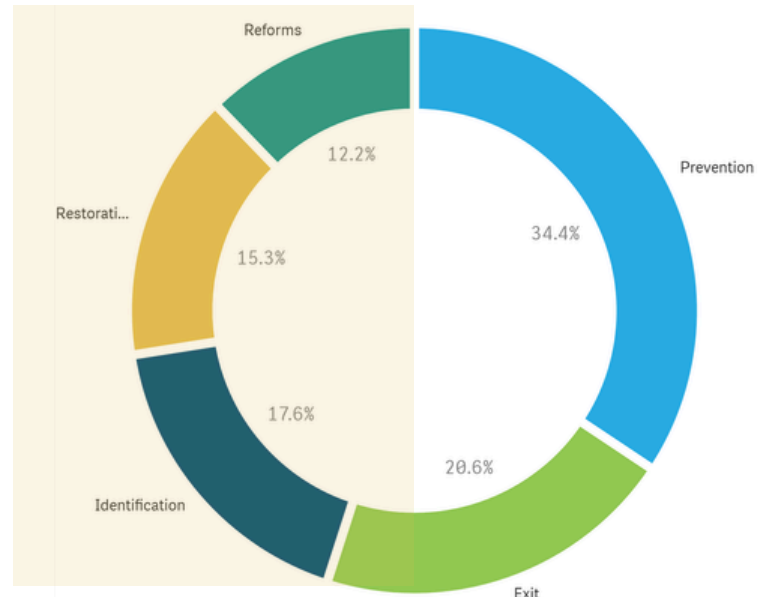

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Rutherford County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 84%, which is considered elevated risk for human trafficking, driven by high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Rutherford County demonstrates **significant vulnerability to human trafficking across 14 indicators, including at-risk industries** such as tourism, bars/strip clubs, and beauty. When combined with **significant foreign-born, noncitizen and limited English-speaking populations, notably high trafficking indicators—including commercial sex offenses, HT tip calls, IMBs, classified ads, and identified CSEM**—and high rates of abductions, SA/DV, and other sex offenses, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of both identified and under-identified trafficking activity.

Expand sex and labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries—including business, manufacturing, beauty services, bars, tourism, and transportation—and vulnerable workers, such as foreign-born and non-English-speaking populations, while ensuring access to support, services and housing.

Train all 128 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Increase local accessibility of temporary shelters, victim advocates, and reintegration support for all victims of crime, including survivors of human trafficking.

Prioritize demand-reduction efforts targeting traffickers, buyers, and illicit massage businesses (IMBs) across all forms of human trafficking.

Ensure healthcare and faith-based communities are trained to recognize, respond, and support human trafficking victims, including clear response protocols.

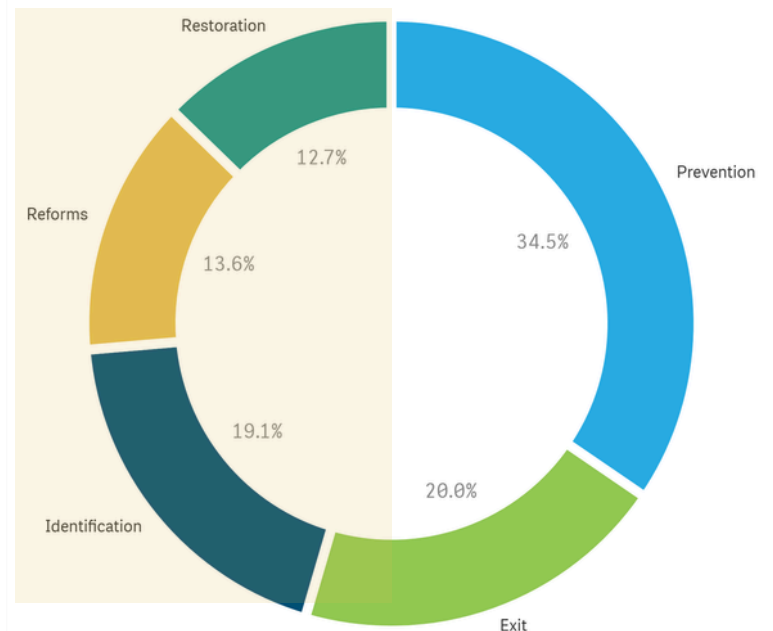

Establish a regional collaborative with neighboring counties—particularly Wilson, Putnam, and Macon—to strengthen prevention, identification, and response to potential under-identified human trafficking.

Equip local healthcare and child-serving professionals to strengthen prevention, early intervention, and care, with a focus on training and protocol development.

Train all 86 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

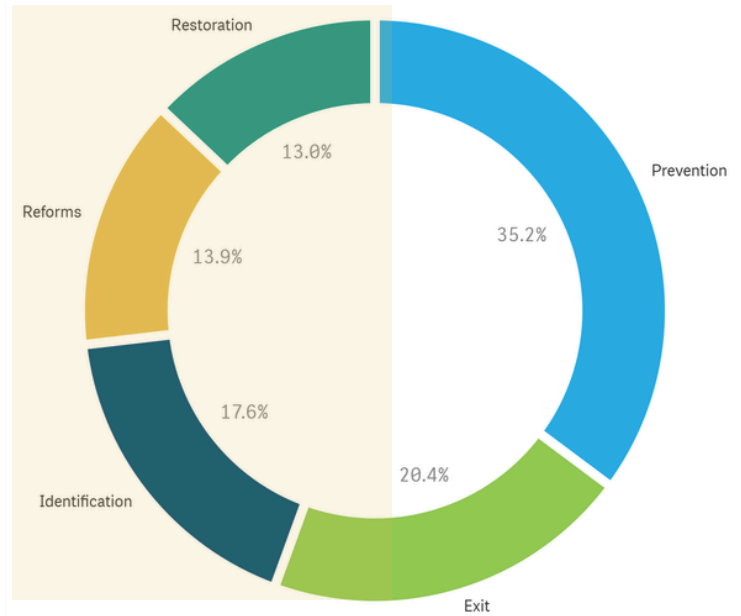

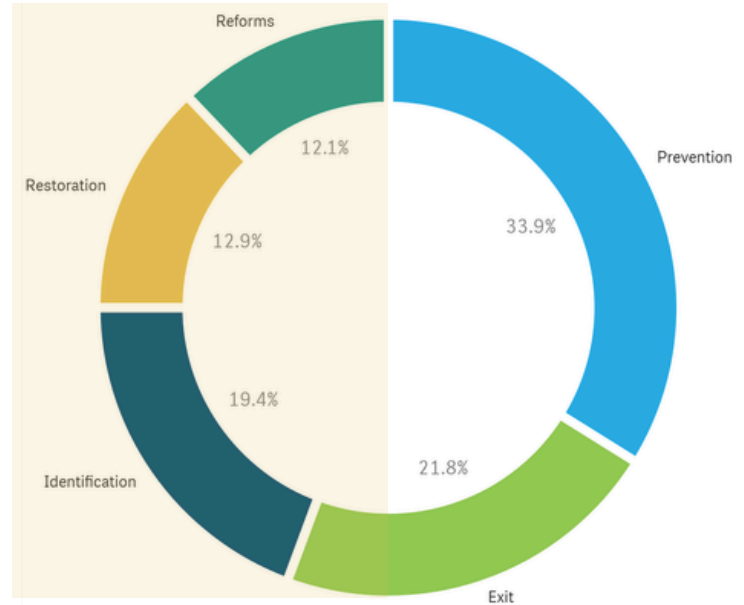

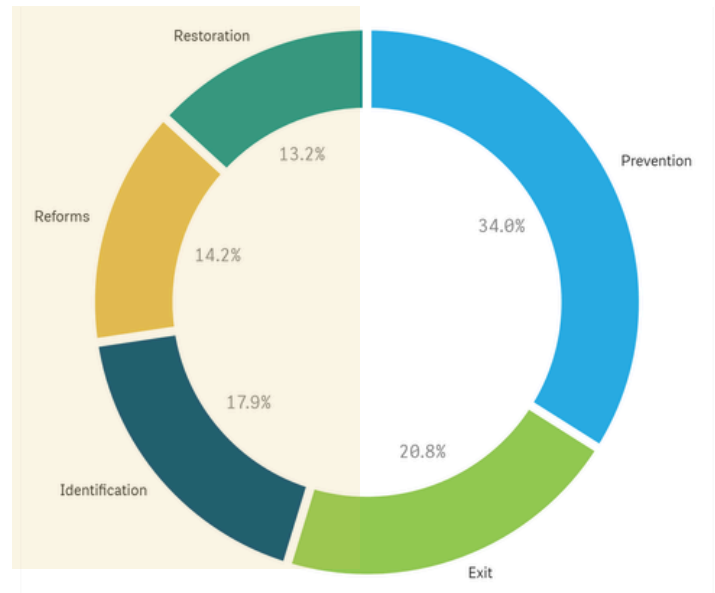

Ensure healthcare and faith-based communities are trained to recognize, respond, and support human trafficking victims, including clear response protocols.

Provide training for all child-serving organizations and law enforcement to identify and respond to human trafficking, including **familial trafficking**.

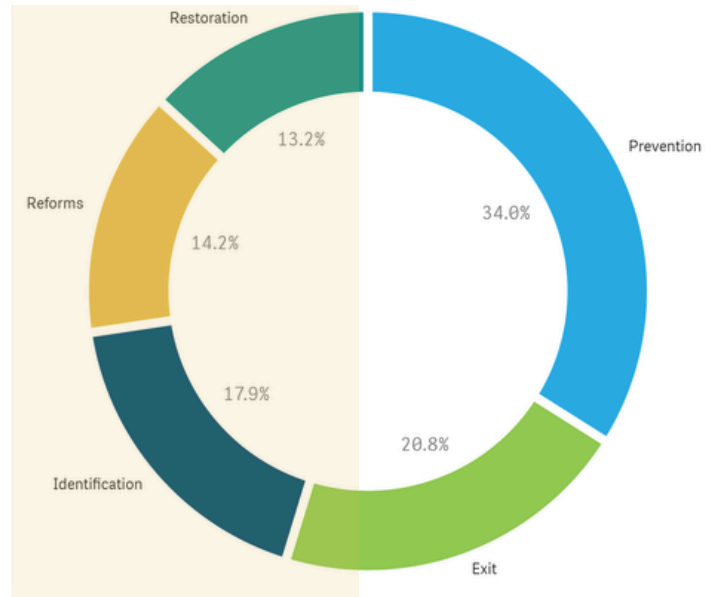

Train all 83 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

To strengthen prevention, **engage the faith-based community** to help meet the basic needs of at-risk families and youth.

Establish partnerships with local healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

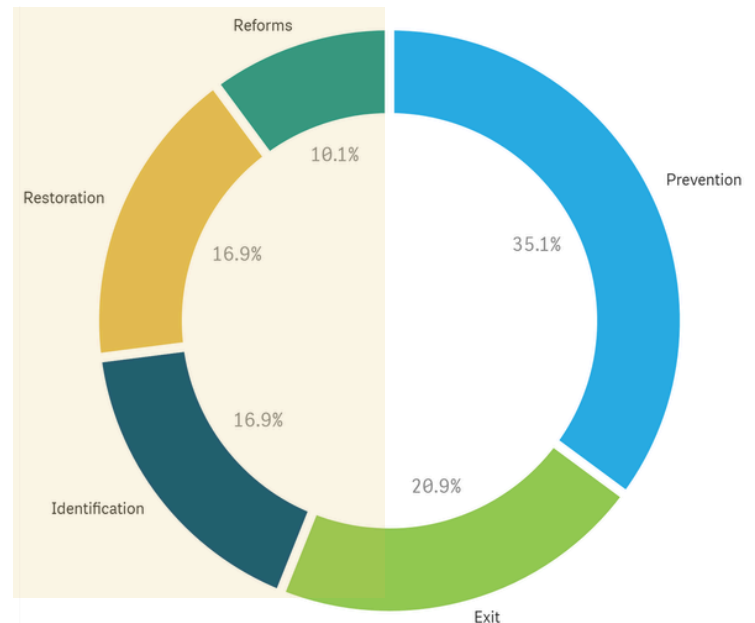

When combined with **exceedingly high numbers of human trafficking tip calls, commercial sex offenses, other sex offenses, IMBs**, and some **identified CSEM**, alongside a high prevalence of foreign-born noncitizens, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of both sex and labor trafficking activity, including under-identified cases.

Prioritize demand-reduction efforts targeting traffickers, buyers, IMBs across all forms of human trafficking, while collaborating with neighboring counties to address regional demand.

Establish partnerships with local healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

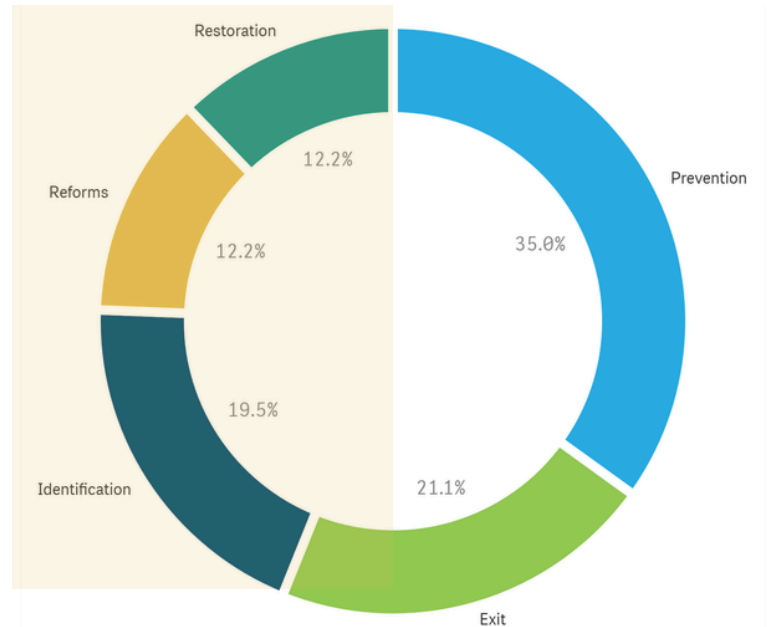

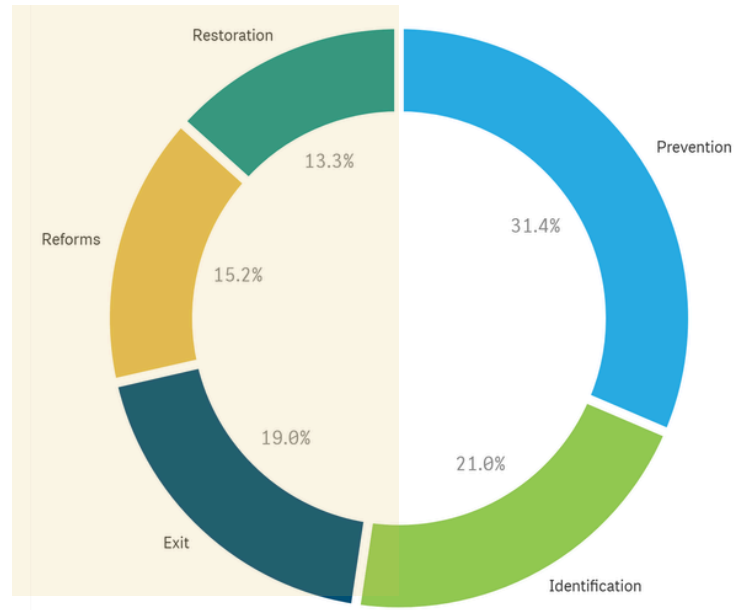

Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Bledsoe County include children and youth in foster care and individuals experiencing poverty and/or homelessness. Those that currently receive the least support include those that are **gang-involved, drug endangered children**, and individuals **experiencing hunger**.

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Bledsoe County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 19%. However, other categories of risk (or specific risk factors) score higher, as follows:

*Bledsoe County's low VPI score likely reflects limited available data rather than actual risk and may underestimate conditions in the county. Available indicators—including **exceptionally high socio-economic vulnerabilities such as poverty, food insecurity, and homelessness**, along with a large population of individuals with disabilities and youth vulnerabilities—indicate a strong likelihood of under-identified human trafficking. The presence of large-scale farming, a local female correctional facility, and proximity to Hamilton County further increase vulnerability.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Traffickers often target children without stable family connections by promising love and security. **Establish a coordinated, multidisciplinary approach** across all local children-serving agencies to address these vulnerabilities with unified training, assessments, and standardized response protocols.

Train all 75 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Engage the agricultural community and vulnerable workers to strengthen labor trafficking prevention and ensure access to support and services.

Provide human trafficking education and exit support for women in local prison facilities.

Ensure healthcare and faith-based communities are trained to recognize, respond, and support human trafficking victims, including clear response protocols.

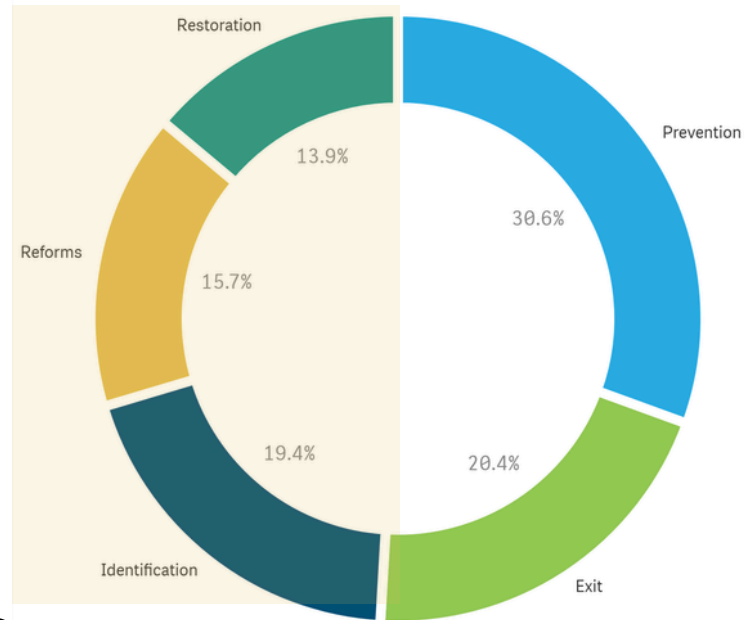

AT-RISK POPULATIONS

Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Bradley County include children and youth in foster care, and individuals experiencing poverty and/or homelessness. Those that currently receive the least support include those that are **gang-involved, refugees and recent migrants, and drug endangered children.**

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Bradley County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 95%, which is considered extreme risk for human trafficking, driven by exceedingly high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Bradley County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with **exceptionally high levels of at-risk manufacturing and farming and extremely high rates of drug offenses.** When combined with vulnerable populations—including homeless individuals, disconnected youth, and foreign-born, limited English-speaking households—and **reported human trafficking tip calls and identified CSEM,** these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity that is underreported.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Expand labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries—including business, manufacturing, large-scale farming, construction day labor, and tourism—and vulnerable workers, including foreign-born and non-citizens, while ensuring access to support, services, and housing.

Train all 98 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Equip local healthcare and child-serving professionals to strengthen prevention, early intervention, and care, with a focus on training and protocol development.

Expand education on all forms of grooming, exploitation, and human trafficking for children, youth and families.

To strengthen prevention, **engage the faith-based community** to help meet the basic needs of at-risk families and youth.

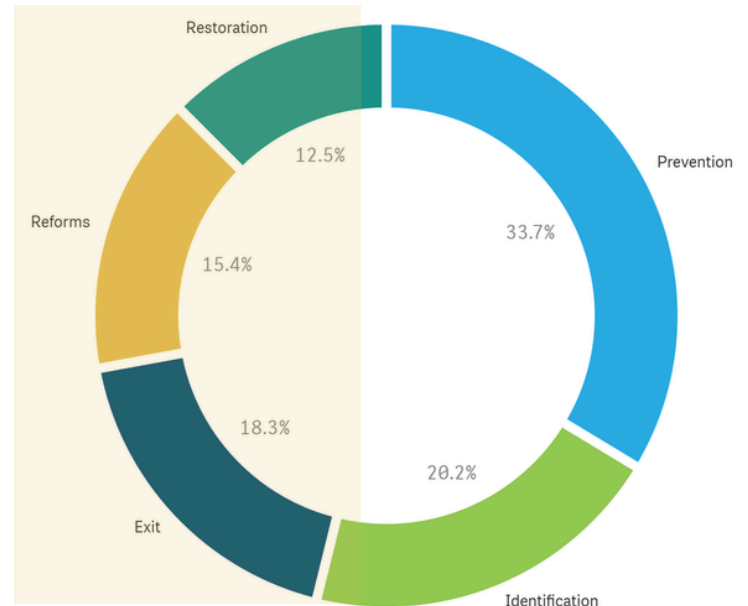

When combined with a growing population of foreign-born, limited English-speaking households and frequent travel outside the county or state for work, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity that is underreported.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Establish a regional collaborative with neighboring counties—including Macon, Overton, and Putnam in Tennessee and Monroe in Kentucky—to strengthen prevention, identification, and response to potential under-identified labor and sex trafficking linked to cross-county employment in farming, manufacturing, and day labor.

Train all 79 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Increase local accessibility of temporary shelters, victim advocates, and reintegration support for all victims of crime, including survivors of human trafficking.

Provide training for all child-serving organizations and law enforcement to identify and respond to human trafficking, including **familial trafficking**.

To strengthen prevention, **engage the faith-based community** to help meet the basic needs of at-risk families and youth.

Train all 83 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Develop a coordinated cross-state response with Madison and Jackson Counties, Alabama, to address high youth vulnerabilities and the likelihood of youth crossing into counties with very high human trafficking prevalence and some of the highest concentrations of at-risk industries in Alabama.

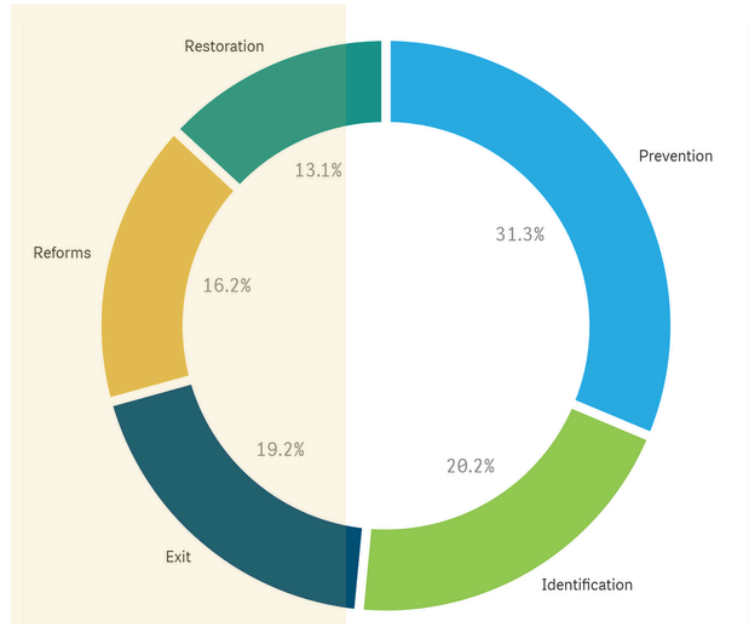

Establish a regional collaborative with Hamilton, Coffee, Franklin, and Warren Counties—including healthcare partners—to strengthen prevention, identification, and response to potential under-identified human trafficking.

Ensure healthcare and faith-based communities are trained to recognize, respond, and support human trafficking victims, including clear response protocols.

Provide training for all child-serving organizations and law enforcement to identify and respond to human trafficking, including **familial trafficking**.

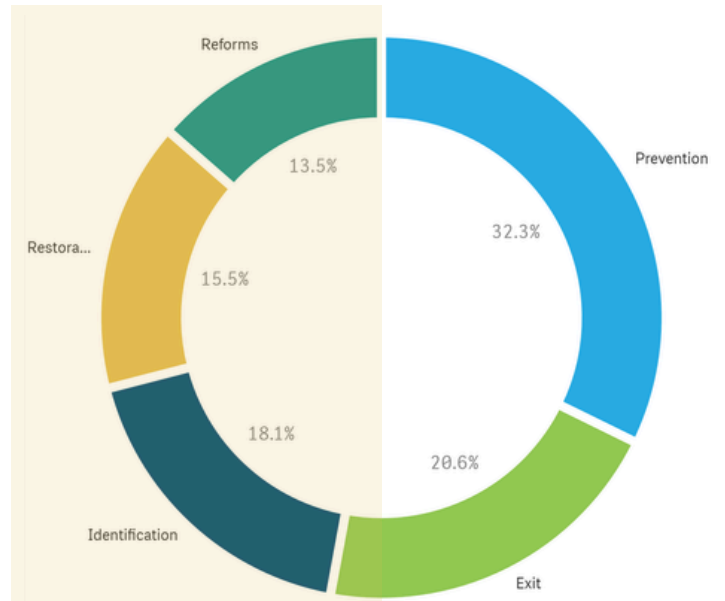

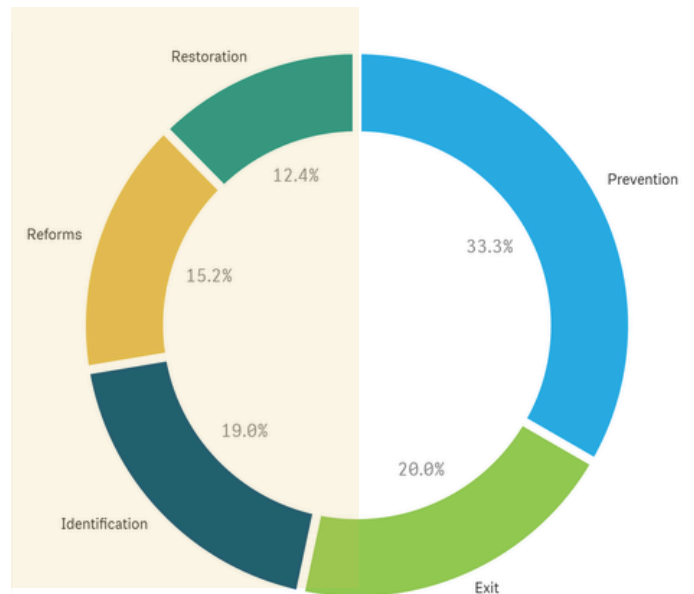

Train all 85 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Establish partnerships with local healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

To strengthen prevention, **engage the faith-based community** to help meet the basic needs of at-risk families and youth.

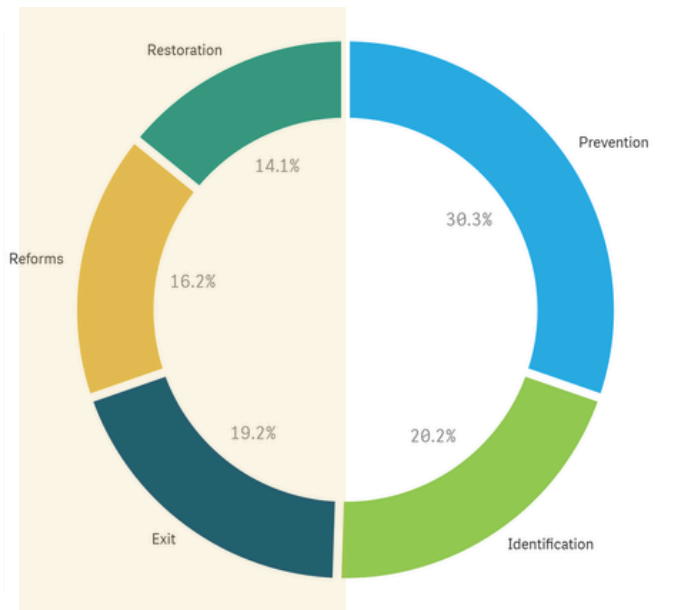

Traffickers often target children without stable family connections by promising love and security. **Establish a coordinated, multidisciplinary approach** across all local children-serving agencies to address these vulnerabilities with unified training, assessments, and standardized response protocols.

Ensure healthcare and faith-based communities are trained to recognize, respond to, and support individuals at risk of or experiencing human trafficking, with clear response protocols in place.

Develop a coordinated tri-state response with Hamilton County (TN), Dade County (GA), and Jackson County (AL) to address trafficking risks along the I-24 corridor, strengthen cross-jurisdictional coordination, and improve identification and service access.

Train all 76 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

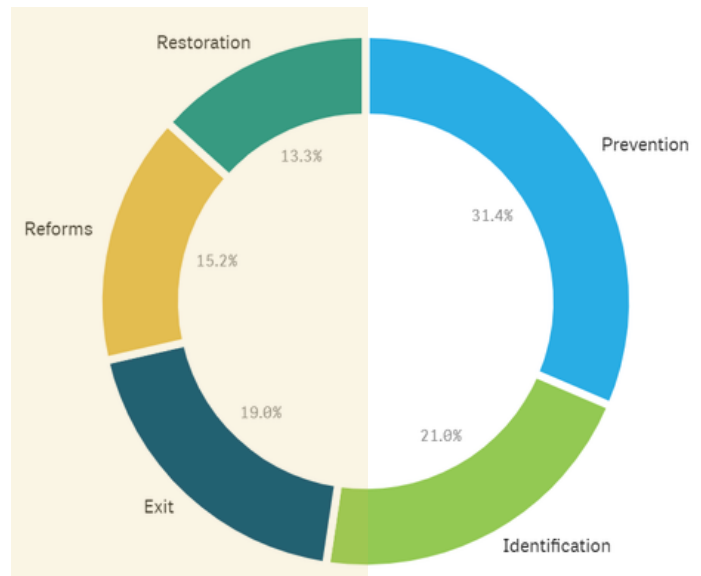

*McMinn County's low VPI score likely reflects limited available data rather than actual risk and may underestimate conditions in the county. Available indicators—including an **exceptionally high prevalence of juvenile court referrals and homelessness**, along with **very high human trafficking tip calls**, at-risk industries, a growing foreign-born, limited English-speaking population, **elevated CSEM cases**, and youth aging out of foster care—indicate a strong likelihood of under-identified human trafficking. Proximity to higher-risk Knox County further increases vulnerability.

Form a multidisciplinary working group—including child welfare, education, juvenile justice, courts, and law enforcement—to assess high rates of youth vulnerabilities, evaluate potential links to labor trafficking, forced criminality, and under-identified exploitation, and develop coordinated education, training, and response protocols.

Train all 84 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Expand labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging manufacturing, agricultural, and tourism sectors and vulnerable workers, while strengthening regional coordination with neighboring counties to improve identification and access to services.

Establish partnerships to strengthen data collection on missing persons/abductions, drug offenses, sex offenses, SA/DV, and child victim offenses to improve planning and identify under-identified human trafficking.

Ensure healthcare and faith-based communities are trained to recognize, respond to, and support individuals at risk of or experiencing human trafficking, with clear response protocols in place.

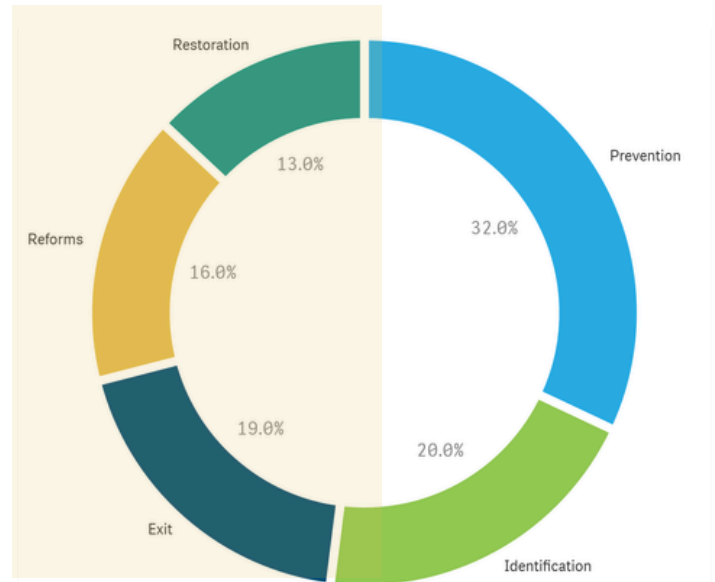

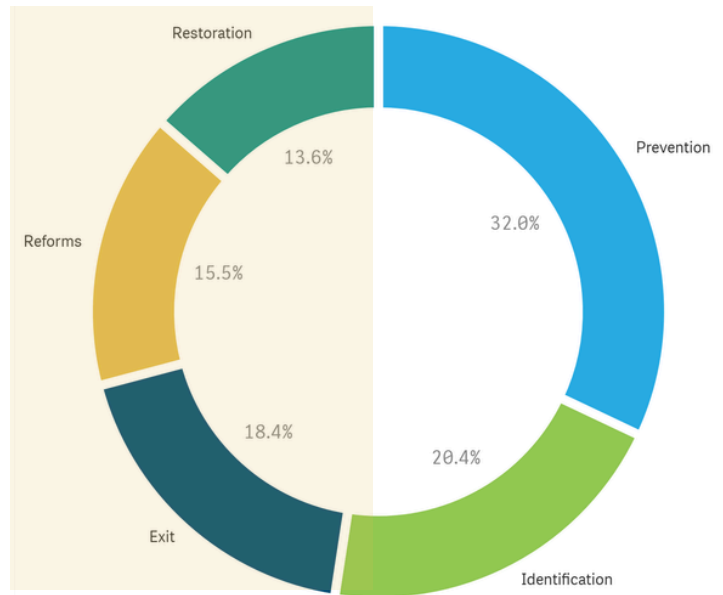

Those that currently receive the least support include those that are **gang-involved, drug endangered children**, individuals **experiencing hunger**, and **refugees and recent migrants**.

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Monroe County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 67%, which is considered elevated risk for human trafficking, driven by high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Monroe County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with an **exceptionally high prevalence of commercial sex offenses**, followed by very high rates of SA/DV, disconnected youth, single-parent households, **human trafficking tip calls**, and manufacturing. When combined with unaccompanied homeless youth, **identified CSEM cases**, and large-scale farming, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of under-identified trafficking activity.

Traffickers exploit local vulnerabilities—including commercial sex activity, SA/DV, and youth risk factors—by promising work, shelter, food, love, and support. **Partner with faith-based groups, nonprofits, and civic organizations** to meet the basic needs of vulnerable youth and families and reduce exploitation.

Train all 77 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Develop a coordinated cross-state response with North Carolina and regional partners to address labor trafficking risks, improve identification, and expand access to services for vulnerable and mobile populations.

Establish partnerships with local healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

Expand education on all forms of grooming, exploitation, and human trafficking for children, youth and families.

AT-RISK POPULATIONS

Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Roane County include individuals experiencing poverty, children and youth in foster care, and individuals experiencing homelessness. Those that currently receive the least support include those that are **gang-involved**, those that are **justice-involved**, and **refugees and recent migrants**.

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Roane County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 58%. However, other categories of risk (or specific risk factors) score higher, as follows:

*Roane County's low VPI score likely reflects limited available data rather than actual risk and may underestimate conditions in the county. Available indicators—including **exceptionally high rates of abductions, juvenile court referrals, commercial sex offenses, CSEM cases, and drug offenses, along with very high human trafficking tip calls and SA/DV**—indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity that is underreported. When combined with at-risk industries such as tourism and construction/day labor, these factors further increase vulnerability.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Form a multidisciplinary working group—including child welfare, education, juvenile justice, courts, and law enforcement—to assess youth vulnerabilities, evaluate links to labor trafficking, forced criminality, and under-identified exploitation, and develop coordinated education, training, and response protocols.

Train all 89 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Establish partnerships with local healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

Expand labor and sex trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries, providing sector-specific training (e.g., hotels/motels), and developing and implementing response protocols.

Strengthen regional coordination with Knox and surrounding counties to improve identification, address demand, and expand services across this high-mobility corridor.

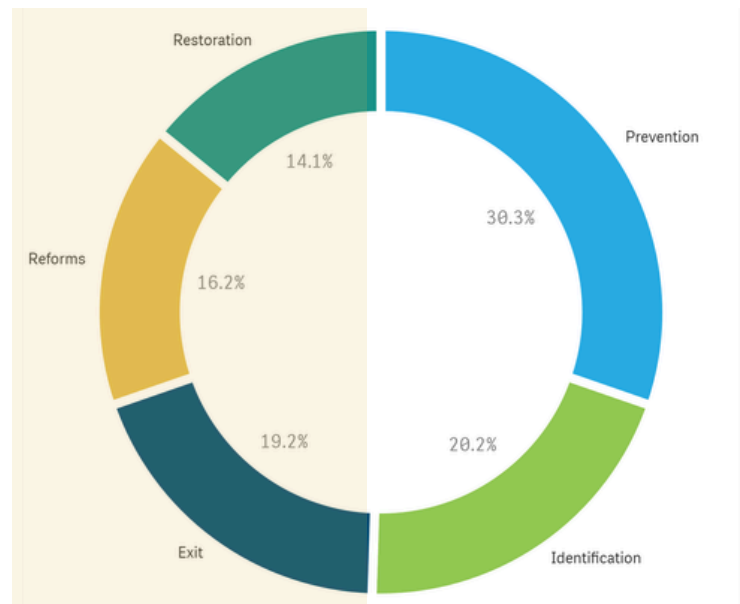

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Sequatchie County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 74%, which is considered elevated risk for human trafficking, driven by high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Sequatchie County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with the **highest rate of chronic absenteeism in the state and an exceptionally high prevalence of youth vulnerabilities**—including children with disabilities, **identified CSEM cases**, children in state custody, disconnected youth, and youth aging out of foster care. When combined with very high rates of poverty, food insecurity, homelessness, drug offenses, foreign-born populations, SA/DV, and adults with disabilities, and commuter patterns to high-risk Hamilton County, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity that is underreported.

Mobilize an urgent multidisciplinary working group—including child welfare, education, youth and disability service providers, juvenile justice, and youth employment programs—to assess extremely high youth vulnerabilities, identify links to labor trafficking and under-identified exploitation, and implement coordinated education, training, and response protocols.

Partner with faith-based groups, nonprofits, and civic organizations to meet the basic needs of socio-economically vulnerable individuals and reduce the risk of exploitation.

Establish partnerships with local and regional healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

Strengthen regional coordination with Hamilton County and surrounding partners to improve identification, expand services, and address trafficking risks linked to cross-county commuting.

Train all 73 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

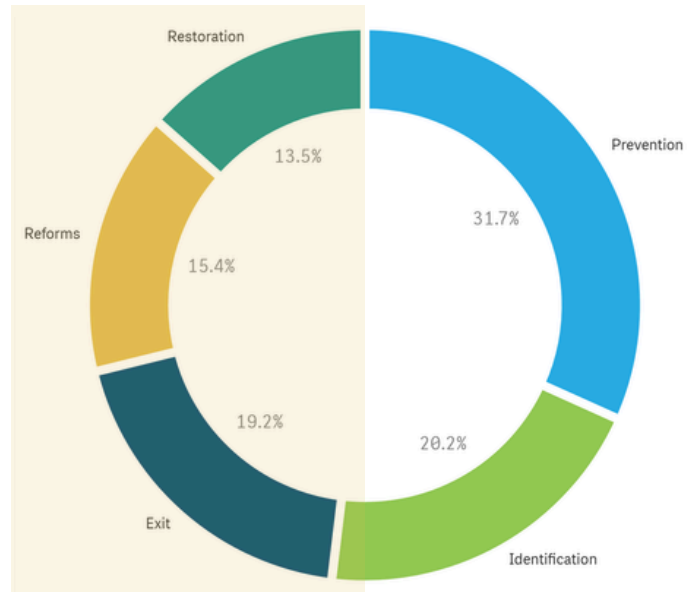

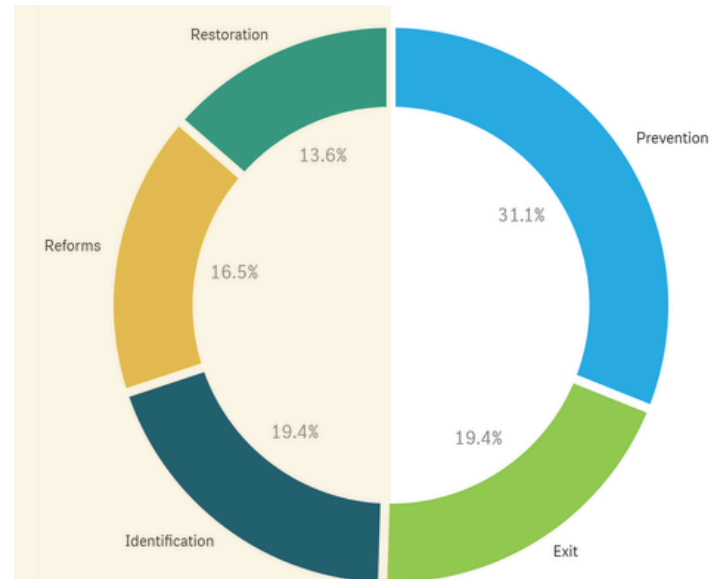

Warren County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 68%, which is considered elevated risk for human trafficking, driven by high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Warren County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with the **highest prevalence of large-scale farming in the state**, followed by **exceedingly high numbers of foreign-born, limited English-speaking households and SA/DV**. 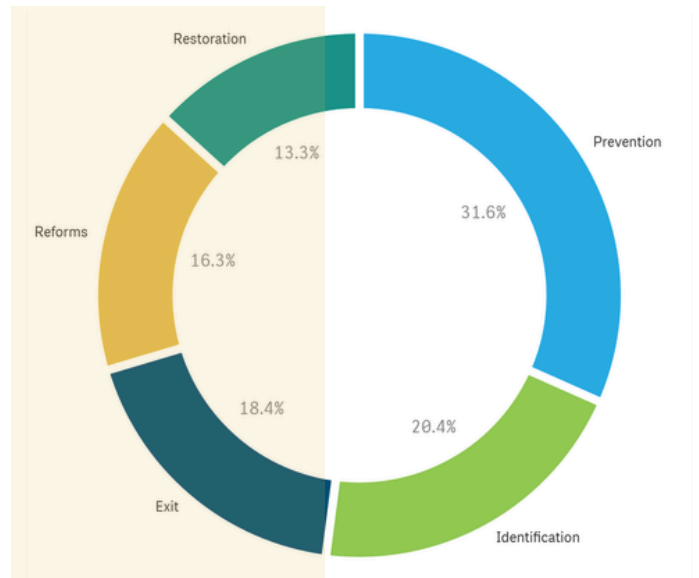

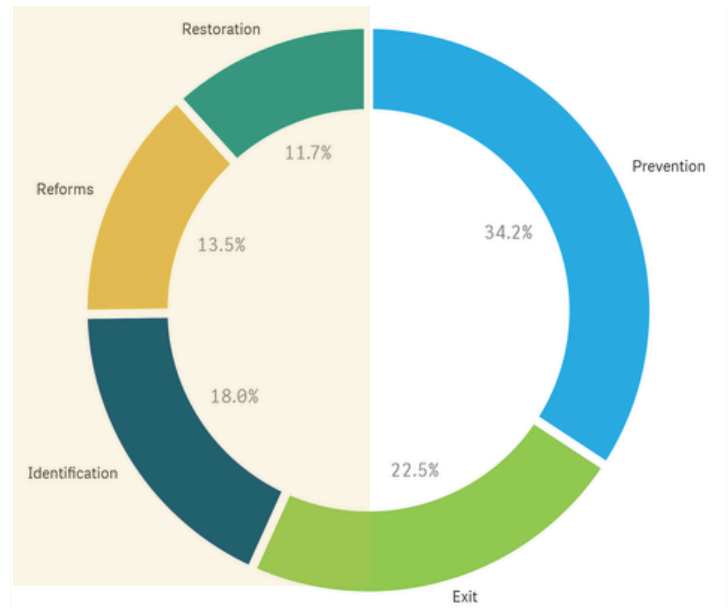

When combined with very high rates of youth aging out of foster care, children in state custody, unaccompanied homeless youth, at-risk industries including tourism, manufacturing, and construction/day labor, and a large foreign-born, limited English-speaking population, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity that is underreported.

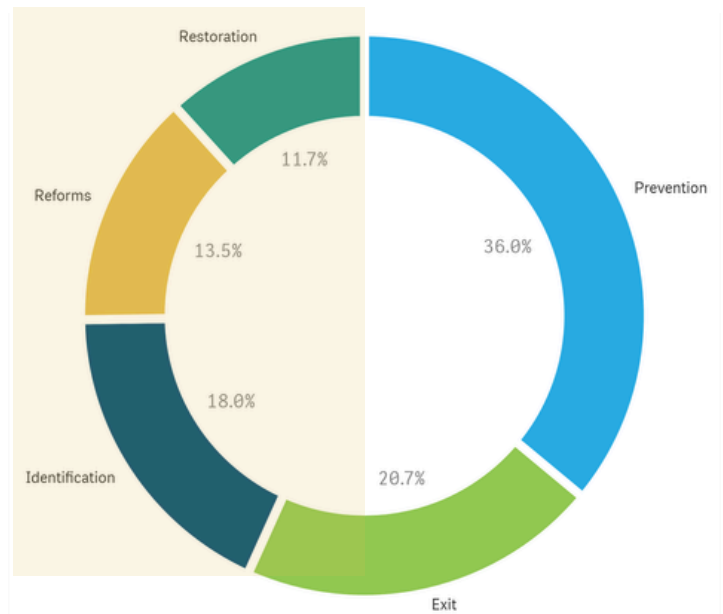

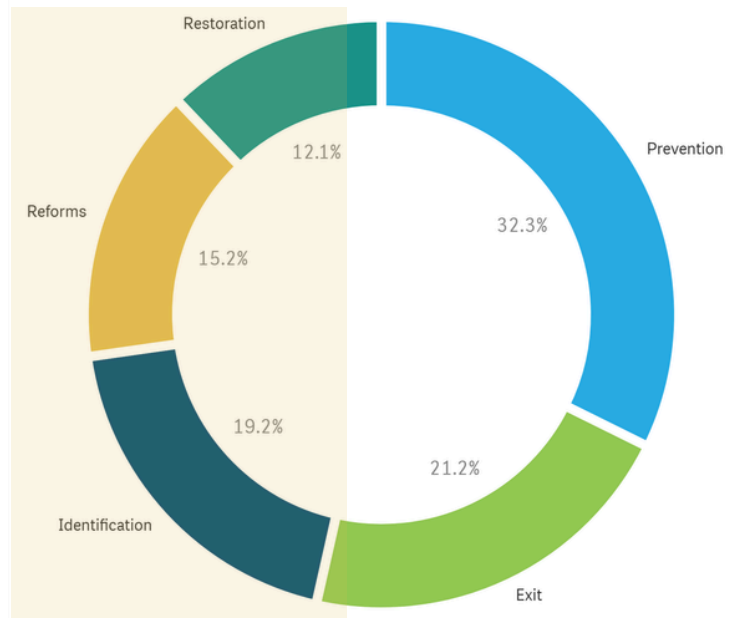

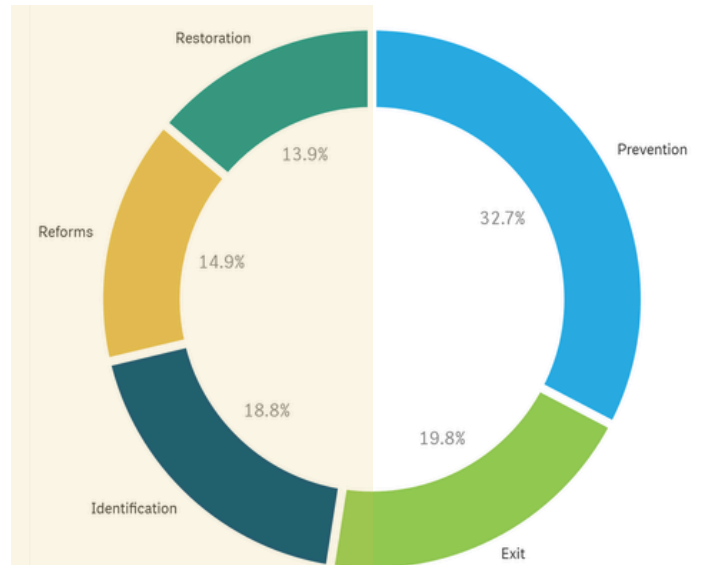

AT-RISK POPULATIONS

Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Carter County include individuals experiencing poverty, homelessness, and children and youth in foster care. Those that currently receive the least support include those that are **gang-involved, refugees and recent migrants, and drug endangered children.**

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Carter County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 77%, which is considered elevated risk for human trafficking, driven by high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Carter County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with an **exceedingly high prevalence of disconnected youth, very high rates of chronic absenteeism and child victim offenses,** and elevated rates of abductions, SA/DV, and weapon offenses. When combined with high levels of disability, foreign-born populations, homelessness, poverty, and food insecurity, along with **at-risk industries** such as tourism and construction/day labor and cross-state mobility with North Carolina, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity that is underreported.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Traffickers often target children disconnected from school, lacking stable family connections, or with histories of abuse by promising love and security. **Establish a coordinated, multidisciplinary response** across local child-serving agencies with unified training, assessments, and standardized response protocols to address these vulnerabilities.

Train all 100 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Expand labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries and vulnerable workers, while ensuring access to support, services, and housing.

Provide training for all child-serving organizations and law enforcement to identify and respond to human trafficking, including **familial trafficking.**

Ensure healthcare and faith-based communities are trained to recognize, respond to, and support individuals at risk of or experiencing human trafficking, with clear response protocols in place.

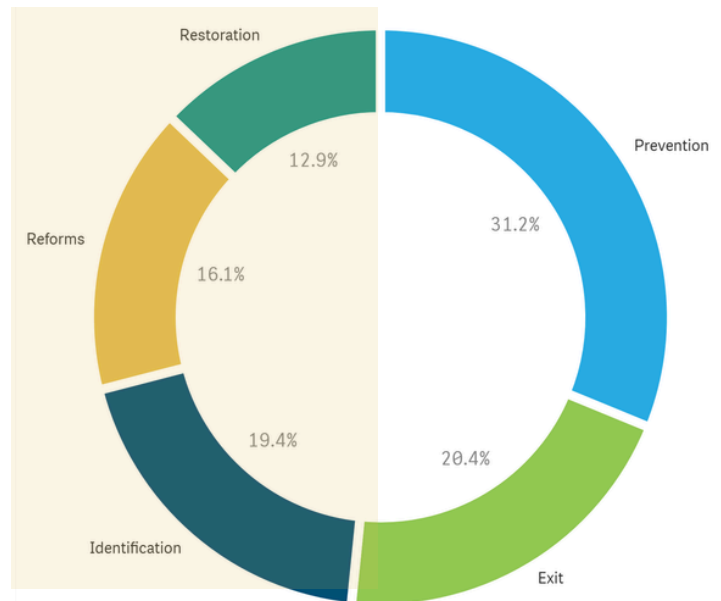

When combined with **significant poverty, food insecurity, adults with disabilities**, very high rates of abductions and other sex offenses, and cross-state mobility with Kentucky, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity that is underreported.

Assess service availability versus accessibility in a community with limited local services and child welfare resources, and expand access to support and services for all victims of crime, including survivors of human trafficking.

Provide training for all child-serving organizations and law enforcement to identify and respond to human trafficking, including **familial trafficking**.

Ensure healthcare and faith-based communities are trained to recognize, respond to, and support individuals at risk of or experiencing human trafficking, with clear response protocols in place.

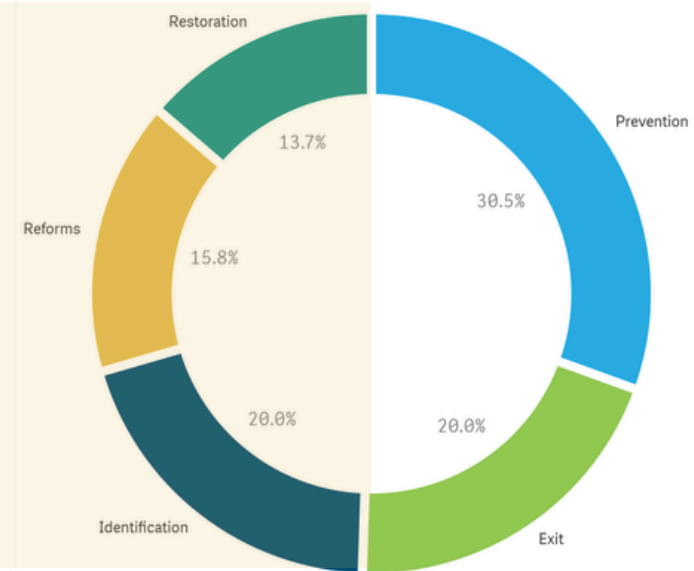

When combined with **significant poverty, food insecurity,** single-parent households, limited English-speaking populations, local crime indicators such as weapon offenses, missing persons, and other sex offenses, and cross-state mobility with North Carolina, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity that is underreported.

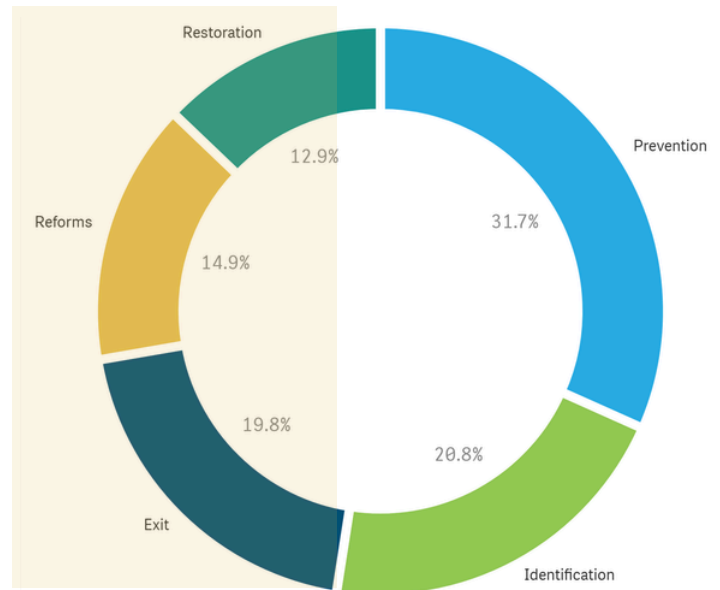

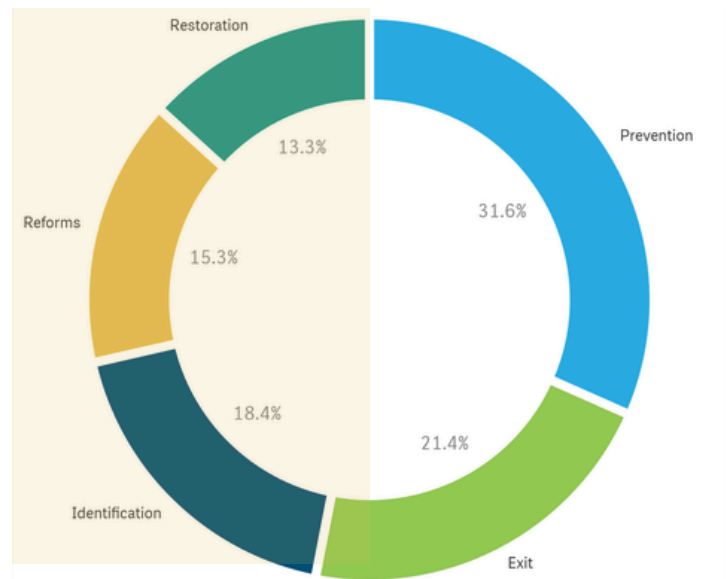

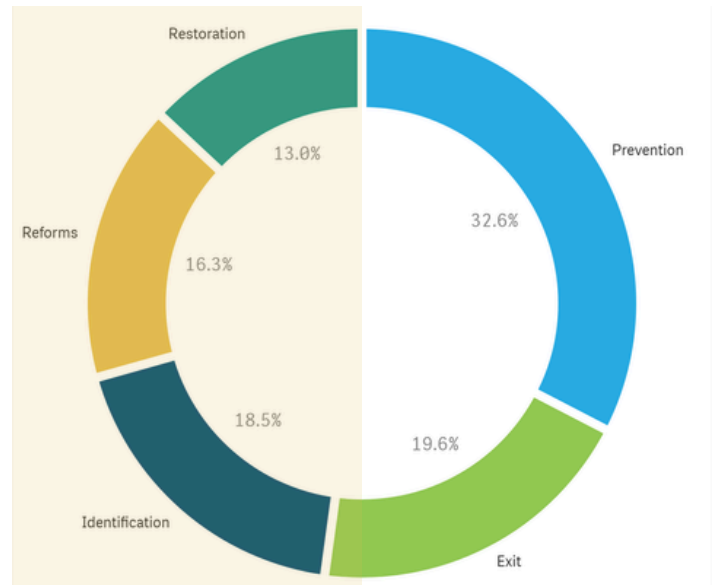

Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Greene County include children and youth in foster care, individuals experiencing domestic violence/sexual assault, or poverty. Those that currently receive the least support include those that are **gang-involved**, **drug endangered children**, individuals **experiencing hunger**, and **refugees and recent migrants**.

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Greene County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 90%, which is considered extreme risk for human trafficking, driven by exceedingly high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Greene County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with **very high levels of human trafficking tip calls and identified CSEM cases indicating known trafficking**, alongside youth vulnerabilities including youth aging out of foster care, child victim offenses, and children in state custody. When combined with **crime indicators**—including drug offenses, missing persons, weapon offenses, other sex offenses, and SA/DV—as well as homelessness, food insecurity, and **at-risk industries** such as manufacturing, large-scale agriculture, construction/day labor, and tourism, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of additional trafficking activity that is underreported.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Traffickers often target children and youth lacking stable family connections, including those with histories of abuse and system involvement, by promising love and security. **Establish a coordinated, multidisciplinary response** across local child-serving agencies—including schools—with unified training, assessments, and standardized response protocols to address these vulnerabilities.

Strengthen law enforcement capacity to identify and respond to human trafficking by providing training on how trafficking is often embedded within drug offenses, SA/DV, missing persons, and other related crimes, and establish coordinated response protocols across agencies.

Expand labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries and vulnerable workers, including at-risk youth, while increasing access to supports, services, and housing.

Ensure healthcare and faith-based communities are trained to recognize, respond to, and support individuals at risk of or experiencing human trafficking, with clear response protocols in place.

Train all 83 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

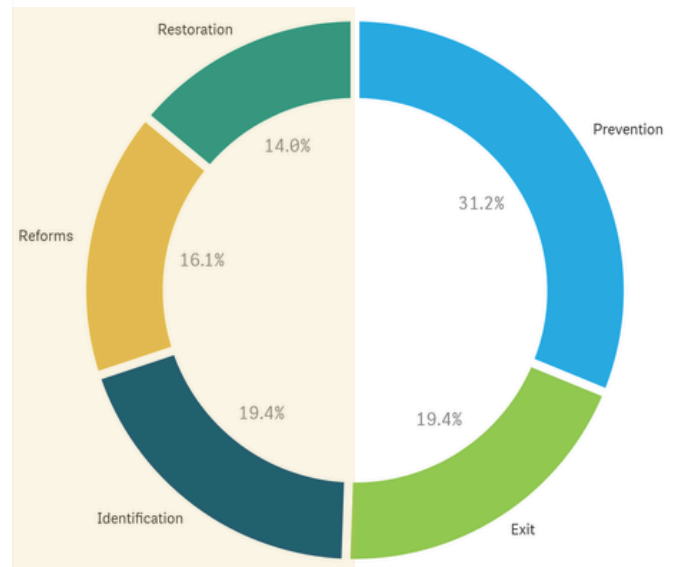

Hamblen County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with an **exceptionally high prevalence of crime indicators**—including other sex offenses, missing persons, weapon offenses, SA/DV, abductions, drug offenses, and known gang activity—along with a large foreign-born, limited English-speaking population and unaccompanied refugee children. When combined with **significant youth vulnerabilities**—including youth aging out of foster care, child victim offenses, children with disabilities, unaccompanied homeless youth, chronic absenteeism, and rising juvenile court referrals—and **at-risk industries** such as tourism, manufacturing, and construction/day labor alongside major transportation corridors and the presence of IMBs, these factors indicate known trafficking and a strong likelihood of underreported cases.

Strengthen law enforcement capacity to identify and respond to human trafficking by providing training on how trafficking is often embedded within other sex offenses, abductions and missing persons, weapon offenses, SA/DV, drug offenses, gang activity, and related crimes; establish coordinated, cross-agency response protocols; and incorporate targeted law enforcement operations.

Ensure healthcare and faith-based communities are trained to recognize, respond to, and support individuals at risk of or experiencing human trafficking, with clear response protocols in place.

Prioritize expanding outreach, education, and accessible services—including temporary shelters, victim advocates, and reintegration support—for the most vulnerable populations with the highest demographic vulnerabilities in the state.

Establish a coordinated, multidisciplinary response across local child-serving agencies—including schools—with unified training, assessments, and standardized response protocols to address extremely high youth vulnerabilities.

Train all 89 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

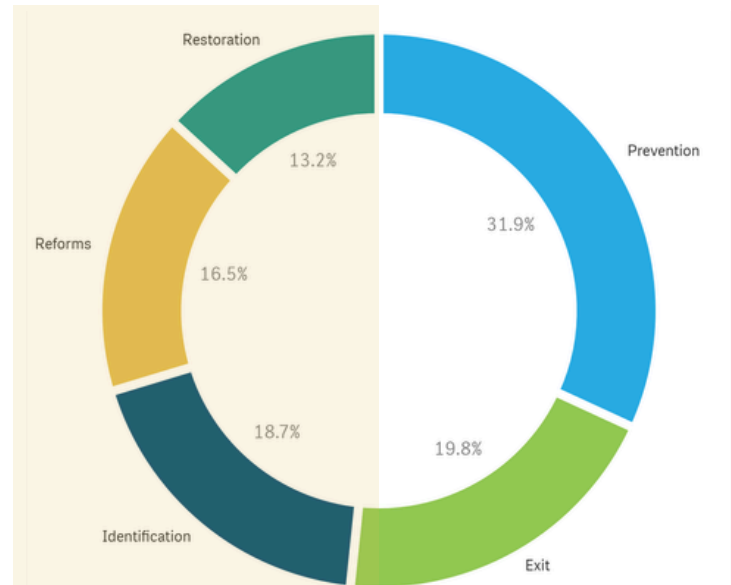

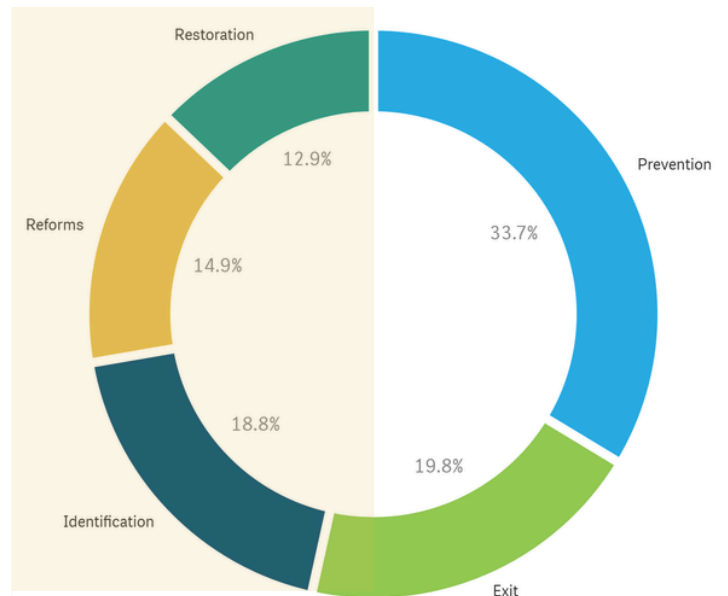

When combined with **very high levels of homelessness, food insecurity, and poverty, reported human trafficking tip calls and identified CSEM cases**, significant manufacturing, and cross-state mobility with Virginia, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity that is underreported.

Train all 95 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Establish a coordinated, multidisciplinary response across local child-serving agencies—including juvenile justice and schools—with unified training, assessments, and standardized response protocols to address extremely high youth vulnerabilities.

Partner with faith-based groups, nonprofits, and civic clubs to help meet the basic needs of vulnerable individuals, youth and families and prevent exploitation.

Establish partnerships with local healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

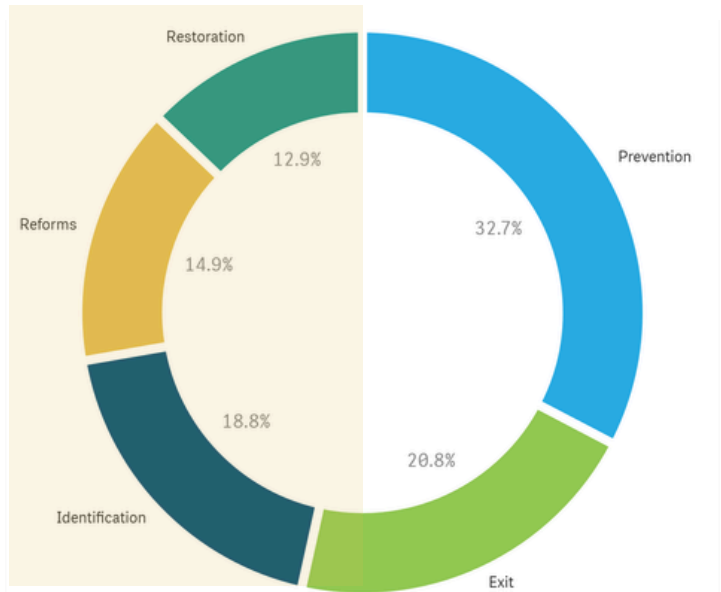

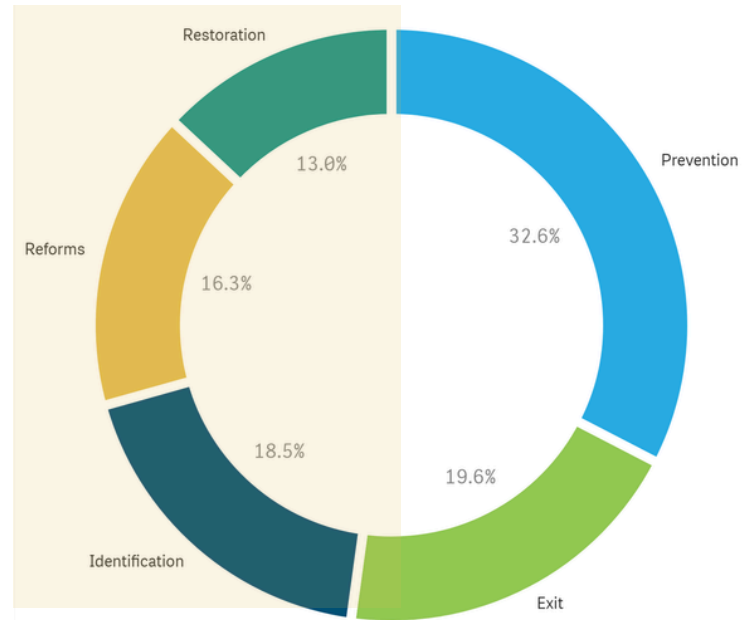

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Traffickers often target children and youth lacking stable family connections, including those with histories of abuse and system involvement, by promising love and security. **Establish a coordinated, multidisciplinary response** across local child-serving agencies—including schools and Juvenile Justice—with unified training, assessments, and standardized response protocols to address these vulnerabilities.

Train all 84 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Increase local availability and accessibility of temporary shelters, victim advocates, and reintegration support for all victims of crime, including survivors of human trafficking.

Provide training for all child-serving organizations and law enforcement to identify and respond to human trafficking, including **familial trafficking**.

Prioritize demand-reduction efforts targeting both traffickers and buyers across labor and sex trafficking.

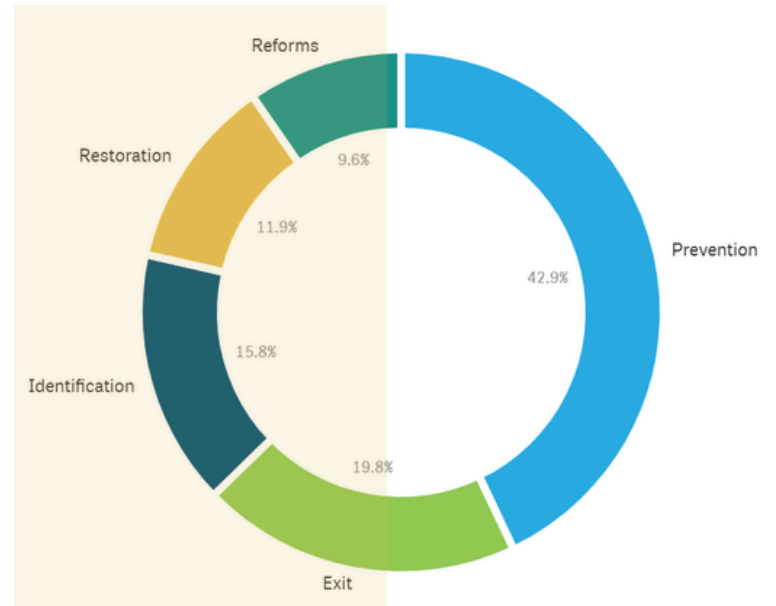

AT-RISK POPULATIONS

Vulnerable populations receiving the most support in Knox County include individuals experiencing poverty, homelessness, and hunger. Those that currently receive the least support include those that are **gang-involved**, those that are **justice-involved**, and **youth aging out of foster care**.

VPI SCORE DETAILS

Knox County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 85%, which is considered extreme risk for human trafficking, driven by exceedingly high scores in several categories of risk (or specific risk factors), including:

Knox County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with an **exceptionally high prevalence of at-risk industries**—including construction/day labor, manufacturing, tourism, beauty services, and bars/strip clubs—alongside **exceptionally high human trafficking tip calls, classified ads, open IMBs, and identified commercial sex offenses and CSEM cases**. When combined with vulnerable foreign-born, noncitizen and homeless populations, **very high crime indicators** including drug offenses, abductions, weapon offenses, and SA/DV, gang presence, **youth vulnerabilities** such as chronic absenteeism and unaccompanied homeless youth, and major transportation corridors and regional workforce reliance, these factors indicate known trafficking and a strong likelihood of substantial underreported activity.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Expand sex and labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries—including the transportation sector—and vulnerable workers, including foreign-born and limited-English-speaking populations, while ensuring access to support, services, and housing.

Establish partnerships with local healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

Prioritize demand-reduction efforts targeting both traffickers and buyers across labor and sex trafficking in Knox County, while coordinating with surrounding counties that rely on Knox for work, entertainment, and beauty services.

Convene key stakeholders—including child welfare, schools, and juvenile justice—to assess current prevention efforts for children and youth and develop a plan to strengthen prevention, identification strategies, and response protocols, including training for all school personnel who interact with children and students.

Train all 208 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

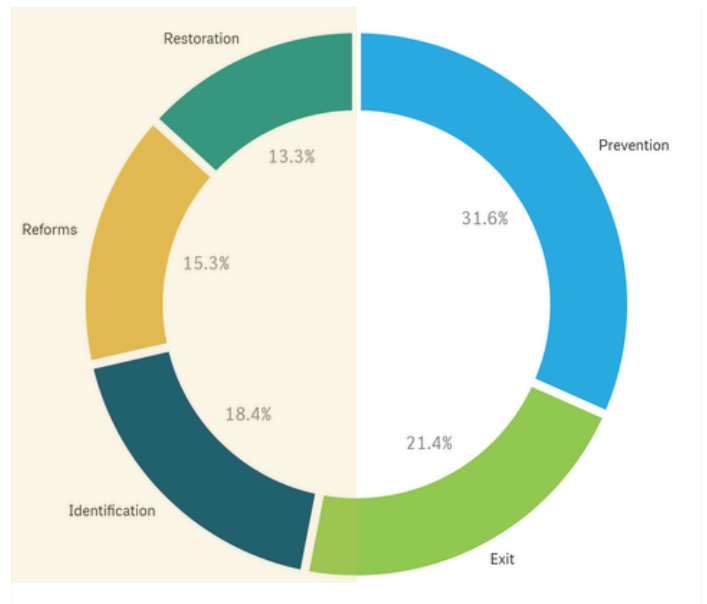

Scott County's overall VPI score in Tennessee is 20%. However, other categories of risk (or specific risk factors) score higher, as follows:

Scott County demonstrates significant vulnerability to human trafficking, with an **exceptionally high prevalence of poverty and food insecurity**, along with very high rates of disabilities and single-parent households, limited access to services and employment, and geographic isolation. When combined with chronic absenteeism, increasing juvenile court referrals, and children in state custody, these factors indicate a strong likelihood of trafficking activity and exploitation that is underreported.

Traffickers exploit socio-economic and demographic vulnerabilities by promising work, shelter, food, and support. **Partner with faith-based groups, nonprofits, and civic clubs** to help meet the basic needs of vulnerable individuals, youth and families and prevent exploitation.

Train all 79 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Engage schools to address the high rates of absenteeism and strengthen prevention by providing education to students on grooming, exploitation, and human trafficking.

Address risks associated with residents commuting to higher-risk counties—particularly Knox County—by **strengthening cross-county coordination**.

Establish partnerships with local and regional healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

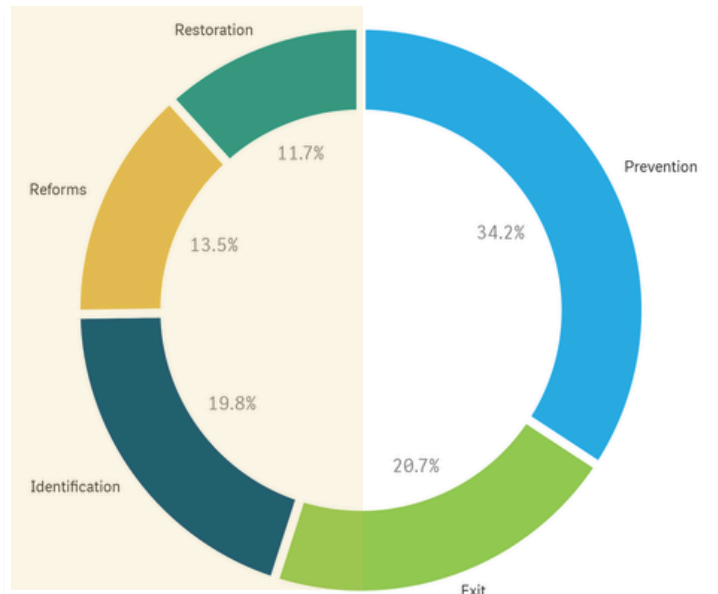

RECOMMENDED PRIORITIES

Given all the data shared above, we recommend immediately prioritizing the following efforts to strengthen your community's response.

Expand sex and labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries—hotels/ motels/ nail salons/ message establishments—and vulnerable workers, including foreign-born and limited-English-speaking populations, while ensuring access and availability of support, services, and housing.

Establish partnerships with local healthcare organizations to integrate prevention, early intervention, training, and coordinated response protocols.

Convene key stakeholders—including child welfare, schools, and juvenile justice—to assess current prevention efforts for children and youth and develop a plan to strengthen prevention, identification strategies, and response protocols, including training for all school personnel who interact with children and students.

Prioritize demand-reduction efforts targeting both traffickers and buyers across labor and sex trafficking, while assessing related crimes—such as SA/DV, missing persons, and other sex offenses—that may indicate human trafficking.

Train all 94 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

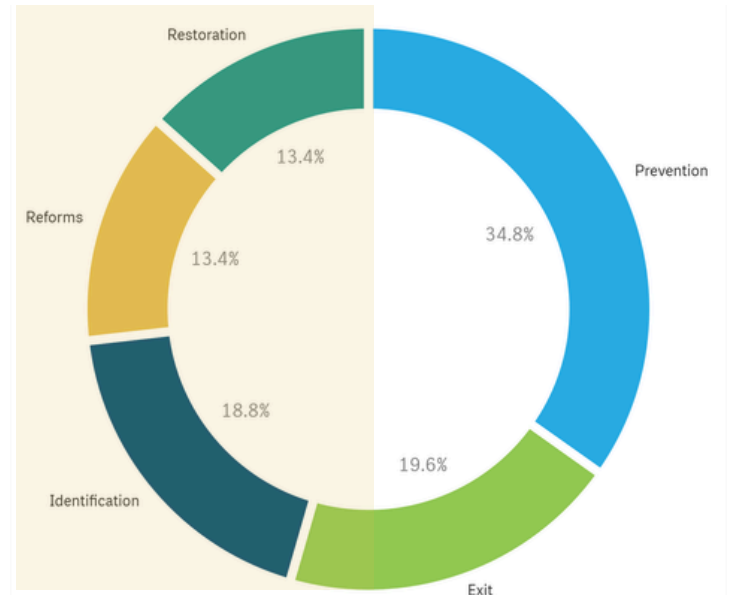

Train all 125 organizations working with at-risk populations how to recognize and respond to both labor and sex trafficking.

Prioritize demand-reduction efforts targeting traffickers and buyers across labor and sex trafficking, including IMBs, while assessing related crimes—such as other sex offenses, missing persons/abductions, SA/DV, and drug offenses—that may indicate human trafficking.

Expand sex and labor trafficking prevention and response by engaging at-risk industries—manufacturers/hotels/motels/nail salons—and vulnerable workers, while ensuring access and availability of support, services, and housing.

Form a multidisciplinary working group—including child welfare, education, juvenile justice, courts, and law enforcement—to assess high rates of youth vulnerabilities, evaluate potential links to labor trafficking, forced criminality, and under-identified exploitation, and develop coordinated education, training, and response protocols.

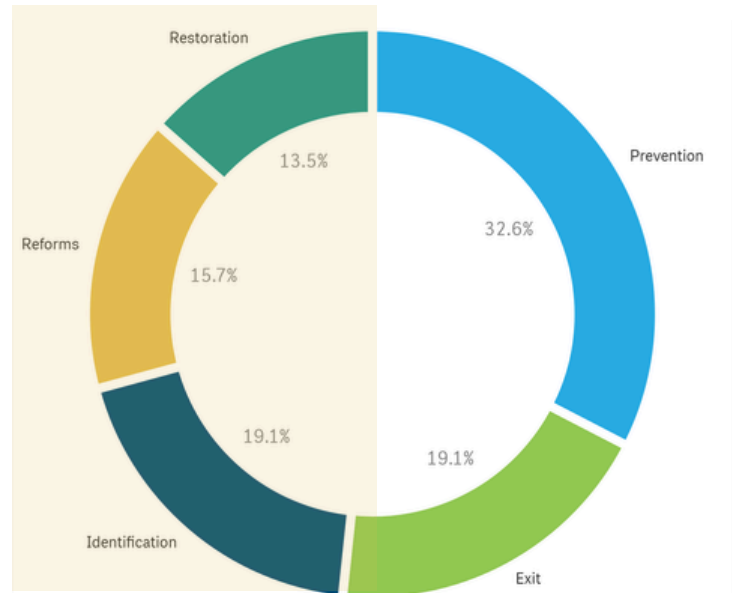

Available indicators—including an exceptionally high prevalence of youth vulnerabilities such as the **highest rates in the state of disconnected youth**, followed by **exceedingly high numbers of identified CSEM and children in state custody**, along with pronounced chronic absenteeism and youth aging out of foster care—when combined with **very high rates of homelessness and disabilities**, limited resources, geographic constraints, and cross-state mobility with North Carolina, indicate known trafficking and a strong likelihood of underreported activity.

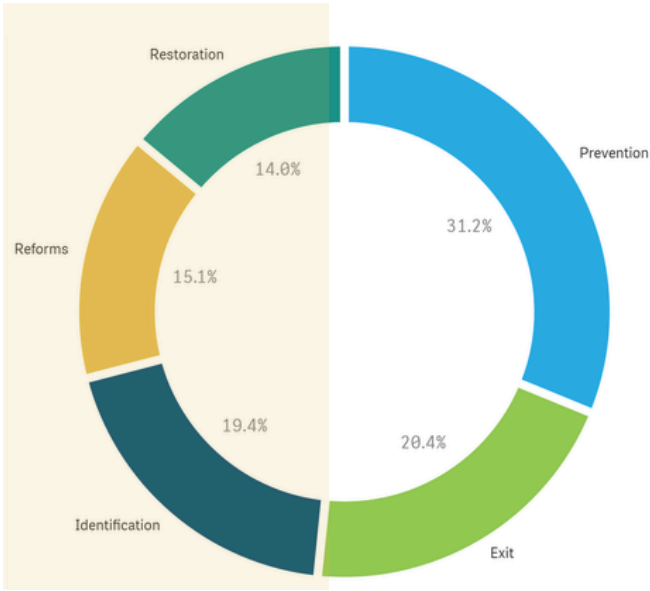

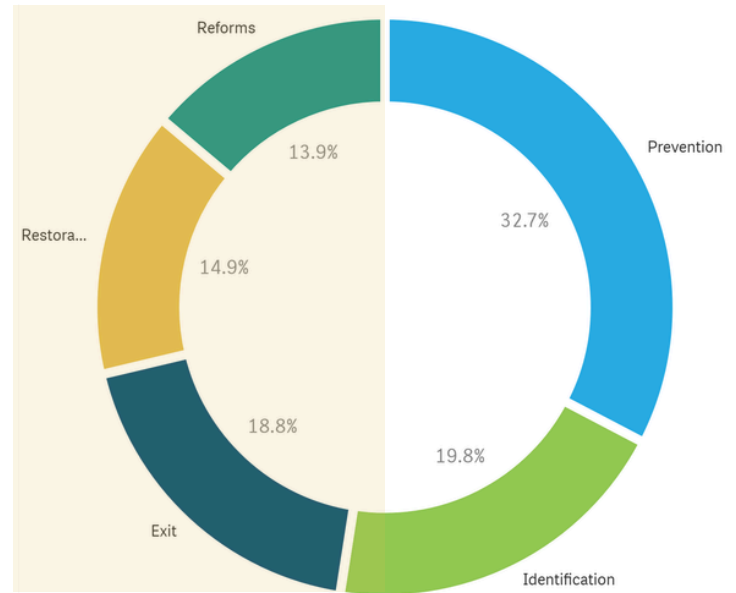
